SEMINAR-WORKSHOP FOR GUIDANCE COUNSELORS ON THE
RELEVANCE OF THE NCEE PROGRAM TO CAREER GUIDANCE

TO: The Director of Public Schools;

1. The Fund for Assistance to Private Education (FAPE) is sponsoring a series of three-day seminar-workshops for guidance counselors on "The Relevance of the NCEE Program to Career Guidance."

2. The workshops aim to orient, train and develop the competencies of the guidance counselors on career guidance and to facilitate a more rational and realistic career planning in relation to the NCEE.
