SUMMER LINGUISTIC INSTITUTE

1. A Summer Linguistic Institute will be held at the Philippine Normal College on April 14 to May 10, 1975 under the joint sponsorship of the Linguistic Society of the Philippines and the Department of Education and Culture with the cooperation of the PNC-Ateneo Consortium for a Ph.D. in Linguistics.

2. The Institute aims to bring to Filipino language educators the most recent scholarship in (1) the sociology of bilingual education (2) language and nationalism (3) language policy and language planning, and (4) psycholinguistics. Filipino and international scholars will compose the instructional staff. The visiting faculty who will be brought to the Philippines with the assistance of the Ford Foundation, will be composed of distinguished international scholars of bilingualism (Dr. J. Fishman, Yeshiva University), psychology of language acquisition (Dr. Norman Segalowitz, McGill University), and language problems in Southeast Asia (Dr. Richard Nees, Ford Foundation, Bangkok). The Linguistic Society will arrange for qualified participants to earn graduate credit at this Institute provided they fulfill all academic and other obligations.

3. A fee of ₱100 for each participant, with an additional ₱50 for attendance at a special workshop on bilingual education will be charged. Students who intend to earn credits will be charge corresponding tuition and other fees.

4. Teachers, supervisors, researchers, and administrators of programs in Filipino and English are encouraged to attend this Institute. Expenses incident for attendance at this Institute may be charged against local funds, subject to availability, and the usual accounting and auditing regulations.

6. It is requested that this Department Memorandum be given priority attention and dissemination.
