**PERMISSION FOR GOVERNMENT OFFICIALS AND  
EMPLOYEES TO THE FILIPINIANO 27, 1975 NATIONAL  
DISCUSSION**

To: All Local Governments  
Head of Offices/Divisions

1. Enclosed herewith is a copy of Memorandum Circular No. 4, D.S. 1975 issued by the Acting Commissioner of Civil Service urging government officials and employees to actively participate in the February 27, 1975 national referendum in order that discussion of the issues would be more fruitful and the citizenry better enlightened.
2. It is the opinion of the Secretary of Justice and the stand of the Civil Service Commission that active participation of government officials and employees in a discussion on the issues done to be submitted to the people in the forthcoming referendum would not constitute partisan political activity. It is the understanding of the provision of the Civil Service Law as "the people are called upon not to elect a new set of local government officials, but merely to decide on issues affecting their form of local government".
3. Considering, therefore, the vital importance of those questions in our national life, officials and employees under this Department should be encouraged to participate in public discussions on the said questions.
4. Immediate dissemination hereto is enjoined.

OF THE NATIONAL AND LOCAL GOVERNMENT, EXECUTIVE  
AND LEGISLATIVE AND NOTIFIED COMMISSIONS

PROMPTLY / Participation by Government Officials and  
Employees in the February 27, 1975 Plebiscite  
Reformulation

The Secretary of Justice in Opinion No. 14, S. 1975,  
opined that active participation in a discussion on the  
questions to be submitted to the people in the forthcoming  
national referendum would not constitute partisan political  
activity within the contemplation of the provision of the  
Civil Service Law.

The Opinion further stated that "in the forthcoming  
national referendum, the people will be called upon not to  
elect a new set of local government officials, but to decide  
on issues affecting their form of local government."

In view of the above and as the Comissioner has a similar  
stand on the matter, it is hereby urged that officials and  
employees of your respective departments be encouraged to  
participate in public discussions on the questions submitted  
in the referendum.

As these questions vitally affect national life, the  
participation of all concerned would result in a more  
fruitful discussion of the issues and in a wiser enlightened  
citizenship.
