INITIATED WORKSHOP ON FAMILY PLANNING FOR HOME ECONOMISTS
IN ASIA

To The Director of Public Schools,
The Director of Private Schools,
The Director of Vocational Education, and
The Officer-in-Charge of Regional Offices:

1. The American Home Economics Association and the Department of Education and Culture will co-sponsor a three-week Lane-In Seminar-Workshop in Family Planning for Home Economists at the Marikina School of Arts and Trades, Marikina, Rizal on May 4-24, 1975. The Philippine Home Economics Association is coordinating the project for the Asian Home Economics Association (AHEA).

2. The main objective of the seminar is to integrate the concepts of family planning and population education into the various curricular levels of home economics to ensure the education of the entire population on the population issues as they relate to individual, family and community welfare.

3. The seminar expects to train thirty (30) Home Economists, twelve (12) of which will be Philippine participants, who will exert some kind of leadership in organizing workshops in their respective regions and countries.

4. One (1) home economist from each of Regions I to III and V to XI, while two (2) home economists from Region IV, or a total of twelve (12), will participate in the seminar.

5. Home Economist-participants shall be selected in accordance with the following criteria:

- a) A home economist with at least two (2) years teaching experience;
- b) A member of the FAO, AHEA, PHEA or of their respective country's home economics association;
- c) Has leadership potential but with no previous in-depth training in family planning/population education;

- i) With previous experience in the preparation and try-out of instructional materials; and
 - ii) Nominated by their respective agencies;
6. The names of the participants to the seminar shall be submitted to this Office on or before April 7, 1975.
7. Transportation expenses for participants in going to and returning from the seminar-workshop site, including the cost of board and lodging, shall be paid from the American Negro Moratorium Association funds.
8. Preferential attention to this matter is desired.
