3. Participants shall be selected in accordance with the following criteria:

- a. Not more than 37 years old.
- b. Physically and mentally capable.
- c. Willing and committed to continue training  
program for the next two or more years.
- d. Have strong leadership qualities.
- e. Not eligible for any scholarship for the next  
two school years (1975-1976) and (1976-1977).

4. Names and designations of participants should be submitted to this Office on or before June 10, 1975.

5. Transportation expenses in coming to and returning  
from the training site as well as stipend of P50 per day for  
each participant will be paid by PEF, subject to existing  
auditing rules and regulations.

6. Preferential treatment in this matter is desired.
