THE 17TH ANNUAL NATIONAL CONVENTION OF THE JUNIOR
CHURCH IN THE COUNTRY OF EDUCATION AND CULTURE, 1975.

To:

Universities

1. The Junior Council of the Children's Bureau and Library, Inc., Foundation (CBI) will sponsor the 17th annual national convention of the members of Delegates from, 1975 at the Deafened Camp, Baguio City. The theme of the convention is "Youth Faces the Challenges of Today."

2. The convention is intended to give the youth a better perspective of their role in the area of nation-building through lectures, group discussions, group reporting, movie film showings, literary contests, and other activities.

3. Participants in the convention are requested to observe the following requirements:

a.) Payment of 1,400.00 - convention fee per delegate/teacher-adviser to cover hotel and board for the duration of the convention and the cost of conference materials.

JR = delegate or junior member's fee

1,00 - teacher-adviser's membership fee

b.) Registration expense from the respective schools to Baguio City and back will be borne by the delegates and teacher-advisers. For those arriving by plane, all delegates from Central District, Bicol and Southern provinces, the assembly point will be in front of the CCA Youth

Centro, opposite the Hotel City Hall; on Arsenales St., Manila at 10:00 a.m. on October 5, 1975, and will last for eight (8) hours. THE NATIONAL CONFERENCE OF TEACHERS AND STUDENTS OF THE COUNTRY WILL BE INVITED.

- 1.) Pre-conference sessions which will be opened to delegates and their teacher-advisers for the general conduct. In these meetings, they would study well the rules on whom and what may be invited by the program of activities. Good practices may be invited to speak on the time and the substance. Because of the benefits that the students can derive from these sessions, these students may be asked to attend.
- 2.) After arrival from Region, the teacher-adviser and delegates with the endorsement of the school principal, should initiate the holding of local conference in the schools of the delegates to whom may be invited scholars from other schools in the locality. The materials used in Region City will be used for this purpose.
- 3.) The schools should send to the National convention three (3) worthy delegates and two (2) non-voting alternates with the teacher-adviser, all of whom should be properly selected and coordinated by the schools they represent. Last year's delegates will serve in their senior year and their teacher-advisers, who will be encouraged to attend the conference.
- 4.) To facilitate filing of registration, the enclosed form should be fully completed and submitted with the corresponding fees on or before Sep. 30, 1975.

- 5.) Considering the importance of the convention in training the youth for leadership, it is enjoined that both all middle students, high youths, student-leaders in school, press editors from secondary schools, both public and private, be encouraged to participate in this assembly.

5. Teacher-Advisors may participate in the aforementioned conventions on official time only.
