1973 HIGH INSTITUTIONAL PERFORMANCE PROFILE (HIP)

To the: Bureau Directors
Regional Directors
Coordinator of State Colleges
and Universities

1. The Education Data Bank of the Ford Foundation for Assistance to Private Education (FAP) initiated the NCEE Institutional Performance Profile (IPP) in pursuance of its objective to stimulate, strengthen and support initiatives in increasing the educational system's capacity for meaningful and sustained improvement. It has come out with the 1973 NCEE data set which regional directors, school administrators and institutional heads concerned will find most useful in educational planning.

2. The IPP data set based on the comprehensive study of the performance of each high school in the 1973 ECCE is described in the enclosure.

3. In view of the increased emphasis in rational educational planning and evaluation activity specifically on the performance of individual institutions, it is believed that high schools who participated in the 1973 ECCE should avail of the IPP data set to be used to plan, initiate and evaluate programs aimed at enhancing their students' academic performance.

4. Subject to availability of funds, all public high schools are hereby authorized to draw from their respective fund resources, i.e., regular appropriation, city or provincial, or from school board funds for the purchase of the 1973 IPP Data Set.

5. It is desired that intensive use be made of the IPP data set in planning and evaluation activities. It is further desired that a statement how they were availed of be included in the annual reports of regional directors and school superintendents.

The IPP data are presented tabularly in two subsets: 1) in summary form and 2) in detailed form. In the summary tables, emphasis is placed on the comparative performance of a school with respect to the school division, the region and the Philippines. The four population levels are defined as follows:

- 1) institutional level - the data pertain to the examinees of a particular high school,
- 2) divisional level - the data pertain to the examinees within the school division where the high school in consideration is located,
- 3) regional level - data pertain to all the examinees within the region where the school is located,
- 4) national level - the data pertain to all the examinees throughout the Philippines.

For each item of the summary tables, data on the four population levels are simultaneously presented. This format therefore allows the school administrator to compare and evaluate conveniently the particular high school in relation to other schools belonging to a division, region and the entire Philippines.

The detailed tables, on the other hand, present data only on a particular high school. The same items are included; however, results are given specifically for the male, female and the total group. These tables present the actual description of the characteristics of the college-bound students of a high school.

Selected variables in the Student Information Sheet (SIS) which were considered relevant to educational planners and admin. officers were included. A special effort was directed at correlating performance with the selected SIS variables. The following provide the list of the tables preserved in the data set:

The IFF data set for each of the 3661 schools whose seniors participated in the 1973 NCEE are for sale at the Education Data Bank, Fund for Assistance to Private Education, FDC P.O. Box 547, Marati, Rizal.
