TRAVEL TO THE PEOPLE'S REPUBLIC OF CHINA

1. Inclosed is a letter from the Honorable, the Secretary of Foreign Affairs, dated August 26, 1975, relative to travel to the People's Republic of China. It will be noted that pending the opening of the diplomatic missions of the Philippines and the aforementioned country, "only Philippine officials and visitors travelling on official business with the Chinese Government will be extended assistance in securing visas."

Sir:

The Department of Foreign Affairs has adopted the policy that pending opening of the diplomatic missions of the Philippines and the People's Republic of China, only Philippine officials and visitors travelling on official business with the Chinese Government will be extended assistance in securing visas. This policy has been adopted in view of the desire of the Chinese Government authorities in Hongkong to avoid incidents which might create problems of the Philippines and the People's Republic of China at this early stage of their diplomatic relations.

All Philippine Foreign Service establishments have been informed of this policy and instructed to refer to this Department requests of Philippine officials and private individuals for visas to the People's Republic of China.

Please inform all the offices and agencies under your Department accordingly.
