ANNOUNCING THE 1976 NATIONWIDE SCHOOL TRAFFIC  
SAFETY POSTER CONTEST

To the:

Bureau Directors  
Regional Directors

1. The Philippine Motor Association (PMA), in cooperation with the Department of Education and Culture, is once again conducting a nationwide traffic safety poster contest. The contest, which started on September 1, 1975 will end on January 31, 1976.

2. The contest is open to all elementary and high school students not more than 10 years old and will be conducted on two levels, regional and national. Posters may be either in English or Filipino or any of the traffic safety rules or slogans listed in the contest rules. Copies of the contest rules will be mailed by the PMA Office direct to school superintendents for dissemination to all schools in the division.

3. All entries in each region shall be submitted to the Regional Director's Office on or before November 30, 1975. The Regional Director shall create a committee to select the best six (6) winners, three (3) on the elementary level and three (3) on the secondary level. All winning entries in the regional contest shall be sent to reach the PMA Secretariat, 4071 P. Magsaysay Blvd., P.O. Box 999, Manila, on or before January 31, 1976.

4. The PMA will award prizes in the national and regional competitions in the total amount of ₱6,180 broken down as follows.

National Competition:

Winning Compositions:

Three winners on the elementary level at ₱100 each  
in 12 regions, ₱1,200.

Three winners on the secondary level at ₱50 each  
in 12 regions, ₱600.

The school of each winner in the regional contest will be  
awarded a laminated certificate of merit; the school of each  
national writer will be awarded a Picnic of Recognition. No  
contestant in any group shall be awarded more than ONE cash prize,  
regardless of the number of entries submitted.

5. The decision of the Panel of Judges (national level)  
shall be final. All entries shall become the property of the  
Philippine Motor Association. Entries shall be judged on the basis  
of artistry, originality, creativity, and effective portrayal of  
traffic safety practices.

6. Considering the importance of the contest in inculcating  
traffic safety consciousness and adherence to traffic rules and  
regulations among the youth, it is hoped that as many pupils/students  
as are interested should be encouraged to participate in the contest.

7. It is requested that regional directors coordinate with the  
school superintendents to give the contest widest publicity to in-  
sure participation of all elementary and secondary schools.

ANNOUNCEMENT OF 1976 NATIONWIDE SCHOOL TRAFFIC  
SAFETY POSTER CONTEST

To the:

Bureau Directors  
Regional Directors

1. The Philippine Motor Association (PMA), in cooperation with the Department of Education and Culture, is once again conducting a nationwide traffic safety poster contest. The contest, which started on September 1, 1975 will end on January 31, 1976.

2. The contest is open to all elementary and high school students not more than 18 years old and will be conducted on two levels, regional and national. Posters may be either in English or Filipino on any of the traffic safety rules or slogans listed in the contest rules. Copies of the contest rules will be mailed by the PMA Office direct to school superintendents for dissemination to all schools in the division.

3. All entries in each region shall be submitted to the Regional Director's Office on or before November 30, 1975. The Regional Director shall create a committee to select the best six (6) winners, three (3) on the elementary level and three (3) on the secondary level. All winning entries in the regional contests shall be sent to reach the PMA Secretariat, 4071 E. Magsaysay Blvd., P.O. Box 590, Manila, on or before January 31, 1976.

4. The PMA will award prizes in the national and regional competitions in the total amount of ₱6,150 broken down as follows:

National Competition:

SECTION II: COMPETITION:

Three winners on the elementary level at P40 each  
in 12 regions, P1,440.

Thirty winners on the secondary level at P60 each  
in 12 regions, P9,180.

The school of each winner in the regional contest will be  
awarded a laminated certificate of merit; the school of each  
national winner will be awarded a plaque of participation. No  
contestant in any group shall be awarded more than ONE cash prize,  
regardless of the number of entries submitted.

5. The decision of the Panel of Judges (national level)  
shall be final. All entries shall become the property of the  
Philippine Motor Association. Entries shall be judged on the basis  
of artistry, originality, simplicity, and effective portrayal of  
traffic safety practices.

6. Considering the importance of the contest in inculcating  
traffic safety consciousness and adherence to traffic rules and  
regulations among the youth, it is urged that as many pupils/students  
as are interested should be encouraged to participate in the contest.

7. It is requested that regional directors coordinate with the  
school superintendents to give the contest widest publicity to in-  
sure participation of all elementary and secondary schools.
