NOMINATIONS FOR SEAMEO REGIONAL ENGLISH LANGUAGE CENTRE

To the:

• Bureau Directors
• Regional Directors
• Coordinator, State, Colleges and Universities

I. 1. The SEAMEO Regional English Language Centre in Singapore has extended its invitation for nominations to its two regular programmes for 1974. Please send three nominations for each of the following programs to reach this Office on or before October 26, 1973.

a. One year Diploma Course in TESL/TEFL from January to September, 1974.

b. Four-month Certificate Course in TESL/TEFL from January to April, 1974.

2. The ten-month course provides training in the theory and practical applications of the principles of TESL/TEFL as well as in language research. It is designed for key personnel or potential key personnel in the areas of English language teaching. The following guidelines for selection of candidates may be used:

The nominees should:

a. have a minimum of three years experience and presently working in the area of English teaching as teacher, department head or supervisor (elementary/secondary level).

b. not have had beginning under any TEC scholarship grant in TESL/Linguistics.

c. be permanent staff members of the agency (public/private school).

- a. have a standard of spoken and written English sufficient to enable them to follow advanced studies conducted in English.
- b. possess the qualities required for the writing of a good research paper.
- c. not be more than 40 years old.
- d. be in good health to undergo an intensive program of study.

3. The four-month course is a problem-oriented course aimed at meeting some of the formative needs in English language teaching of the member countries. The course is designed primarily for those in a position in the education service to influence or stimulate the raising of English-teaching standards in their countries.

The nominees to this program should

- a. be teacher-training or university college lecturers, coordinators/department heads of English, supervisors of English, curriculum materials specialists, research designers and workers with a minimum experience of three years in the area of English instruction.
 - b. possess qualities required for identifying research problems, doing research and writing a good research paper.
 - c. have had some basic training in the area of TESL/Teaching English as a Second Language to be able to undergo an intensive problem-oriented course in TESL.
 - d. be in good health to successfully complete an intensive program of study.
 - e. be permanent staff members of the agency (public/private) to which they belong.
 - f. not to be more than 45 years old.
4. The agencies concerned should set up their own screening committees to choose the three nominees for each program with primary consideration of the needs of the different divisions within

The Philippine Motor Association in co-operation with the Department of Education and Culture is conducting the twelfth nationwide school traffic safety poster contest during the school year 1975 - 1976. This PMA project is a public service to help inculcate traffic safety consciousness among pupils and students.

The Contest is endorsed by the Secretary of Education and Culture and is open to all elementary and secondary school students all over the Philippines.

A committee to take charge of the contest has been created as follows: Col. Jose D. Regala, MNSA; Director, Philippine Motor Association as Chairman; the members of the Committee are Mr. Macario Aguirre, Asst. Chief, National Scholarship Center, Department of Education and Culture; Mrs. Marisa Redoblado, Cultural Affairs Officer, Department of Education and Culture; the Director, Bureau of Elementary Education; the Director, Bureau of Secondary Education; Dr. Eligio Enriquez, Art Association of the Philippines and Col. Delvin Jaramillo of Safety Organization of the Philippines (SOPPI).

CONTEST RULES

The Contest Committee has promulgated the following rules to govern the Contest:

RULE I. The Contest opens September 1, 1975 and closes January 31, 1976. Mailed entries shall be postmarked not later than January 31, 1976.

RULE II. The Contest shall be opened to all pupils and students attending elementary and secondary schools all over the country.

RULE III. All entries in each region shall be submitted to Regional Director's Office for selection of the winners in the Regional Contest on or before November 30, 1975. All winners in the Regional Contest shall be sent to reach the PMA Secretariat, 4071 R. Magsaysay Blvd., P.O. Box 999, Manila on or before January 31, 1976.

RULE IV. Entries shall be judged on the basis of utility, originality, simplicity, and effectiveness of traffic safety practice.

RULE V. Entries shall be submitted on white paper size 8 1/2 inches by 11 inches or 8 1/2 higher by 13 inches. The following information shall be placed at the back of the poster:
