SUMMER CLASSES FOR TEACHERS OF CORE EDUCATION

To: Bureau Directors
Regional Directors
Schools Superintendents

1. Summer classes for teachers of work education - industrial arts, practical arts and home industries, and food service for teachers of Home Economics, Food Trades and Home Science - will be conducted at the Home Industries Training Center, corner Ayala Boulevard and San Marcelino Street, Manila and at the Food Service Training Laboratory, DEC compound, respectively, from April 19 to May 26, 1976.

2. The following courses will be offered:

a. At the Home Industries Training Center

Arts and Crafts Design	Hand Loom Weaving
Bag Making	Cupiz
Bird-Mechanocraft	Wood-Lumber Crafts
Ceramics	Upholstery

b. At the Food Service Training Laboratory

Food Service

Applicants for the summer courses are expected to observe the following:

- (1) They should provide themselves with supplies and materials needed in the course.
- (2) They should enroll in courses that involve the use of the materials available in their communities or which have relevance in their teaching assignments.
- (3) Training sessions are conducted on a voluntary basis. However, for teachers who are enrolled in other teacher-training institutions, enrollment either in the morning or in the afternoon is allowed.

- (4) The nature of the training is largely on-the-job.
- (5) A certificate of attendance indicating the number of hours actually attended is issued at the end of the training. Participants must have no other commitments during the training.

3. Applicants may register for the courses by mail or in person at the Home Industries Training Center at the above address. Those applying by mail should send their applications not later than April 16, 1976. Applications of those attending on official time should be accompanied by a recommendation from their superintendents of schools or by routing officials of their school divisions.

4. Attendance of supervisors or teachers in home industries courses is purely voluntary and therefore, will not entitle them to service credits, travelling expenses and per diem. Tuition and registration fees are free.
