SCHEMES FOR CARE/CRS SCHOOLS FOR A 300-CALORIE  
SUPPLEMENTARY FEEDING A WEEK

To the: Bureau Directors  
Regional Directors  
Chiefs of Services and Heads of Units  
Coordinator, State Colleges and Universities  
Schools Superintendents

1. In connection with the phasing out of foreign food assistance and toward encouraging reliance on indigenous food, the following alternative schemes are proposed for adoption by CARE/CRS schools:

- a. CARE/CRS schools should be responsible for a one-day-a-week feeding equivalent to 300 calories, utilizing local or indigenous food (Department Memorandums Nos. 206 and 234, s. 1975). This one day could be the ANP feeding day.
- b. The children should be given daily a 250-calorie nutrition, but the schools shall provide a daily 50-calorie food supplement with the nutrition.

2. To support any of these schemes, the schools shall utilize school/home garden produce. They may also seek community assistance and/or draw judiciously from the Special Education Fund (E.A. No. 5447) under education research (Department Memorandum No. 206, s. 1975, sections 3 and 4). A CARE/CRS school should adopt only one scheme which is best suited to its resources and/or conditions.

3. Recipes for the 50-calorie supplementary feeding should be prepared for use this coming school year. To minimize baking cost, it is suggested that the school oven be utilized for other cooking purposes after baking nutrients.

4. This school commitment for a 300-calorie supplementary feeding shall be put into effect in June, 1976 without any exception.
