THE 1976 NATIONAL MUSIC COMPETITIONS  
FOR YOUNG ARTISTS

To the: Bureau Directors  
Regional Directors  
Coordinator, State Colleges  
and Universities  
School Superintendents

1. The 1976 or Fourth National Music Competitions for Young Artists will be held on the last week of November through the first week of December to coincide with the National Music Week declared in Presidential Proclamation No. 1175 dated August 7, 1975.
2. In 1972, the Cultural Center of the Philippines, in association with the Chorale Philippines, launched a unique project geared towards the development of young talents and the cultivation of high quality music in the Philippines. The First National Children's Choir competition was held with contestants from the Greater Manila Area and adjoining provinces only. In 1973, however, the competition became national in character.
3. This year's competitions will not only be confined to children's choirs but also to solo instruments, piano solos, youth choirs, and family ensembles. For the piano competitions, Category C is planned to encourage graduate students in piano to maintain a high standard of performance.
4. The National Music Competitions for Young Artists have been planned as annual affairs to promote, develop, and preserve Philippine music. Thus, participants in the various categories are required to perform one Filipino song by a Filipino composer to ensure the participation of our youth in the continuing task of nation-building through a rich and more distinctively Filipino cultural heritage.

5. Regional and Division Music Supervisors are hereby designated Regional Coordinators to oversee the contests in their respective areas in collaboration with representatives of the Cultural Center of the Philippines, General Philippines, Piano Teachers' Guild of the Philippines, Tennessee Musicians of the Philippines, and Philippine Society for Music Education, all under the chairmanship of the First Lady, Mrs. Imelda Romualdez Marcos. Transportation and other allowances incident to the supervisors' assignments may be charged against regional and division funds.

6. Enclosed are the rules and regulations for the five contest categories, the list of the Regional Secretariat, and the list of winners in the 1975 National Music Competitions.

7. It is desired that the contents of this Department Memorandum be given the widest publicity in the field.

1976 NATIONAL MUSIC COMPETITIONS FOR YOUNG ARTISTS

GENERAL RULES AND REGULATIONS

The rules and regulations related herein shall be binding in all the contest categories whether regional or final.

1. Participants shall compete (if choir) or audition (for all contest categories) in the regional elimination contests sometime in September and October. The venue shall be designated by the Regional Secretariat.

2. A regional competition shall have at least 10 participating choirs to qualify as a region.

3. One choir out of every ten choirs may qualify for the final competition in Manila. This applies to all regions except Greater Manila. Contestants in the other contest categories may join the finals subject to approval and recommendation of the Board of Judges.

4. No contestant's teacher or anyone connected with a contestant should contact any of the judges in connection with the solicitude or rating the contestant received at the time of competition.

5. Deliberation or the evaluation of the performance before the final decision should be held confidential among the judges.

6. The Chairman of the Board of Judges to the regional contest shall be provided by the National Secretariat. The jury will be composed of selected artists and music educators of national/international reputation.

7. A registration fee of P50 shall accompany the application of each competing choir, group or individual.

8. All officers and personnel of the GSA and the NACMA are excluded from participation in the competition.

9. First Prize winners are no longer eligible to compete in the succeeding annual competitions.

10. The awarding of prizes may be withheld should the Board of Judges deem it appropriate. The decision of the Board of Judges is final.

11. Application forms for Manila region may be secured from the CCP National Secretariat office during regular office days. Contestants from the provinces may secure their forms from their respective regional secretariats.

12. Transportation and other expenses to and from the competition site shall be provided by the participants.

13. Individual or group participants (except choirs) shall submit a copy of his/her birth certificate together with a black and white glossy photograph also 2 x 2 1/2 for the individual and 3 x 5 for the group.

14. The participants shall abide by the rules and regulations of the CCP competitions as prescribed.

15. First prize winners in the previous year's competitions shall be invited to participate in the current year's festival to be held in December.

c. One Filipino composition (free selection) sung in any Filipino dia. set, shall be used for the regional and final contests.

d. Choirs joining the competition for the second time must have five (5) additional songs in their repertoire. For their applicants organized at least six months before the competition, must have at least five (5) songs in their repertoire.

e. The choir may sing the above three songs in any order. All songs must be in the treble (g-clef) score.

9. All songs shall be memorized. No choreography or body movement is allowed.

10. Participating choirs are required to come to the regional competition in uniforms without school or any other identifying marks.

11. No soloists are allowed.

12. Participating choirs must submit the following to the Regional Secretariat by August 30, 1976 (September 30, 1976 for Greater Manila Area),

a. Application form, one copy to JCP and one copy to Regional Secretariat.

b. Choir picture (black and white) one copy; size 9 x 9 glossy.

c. Conductor's picture 2x x 2x with printed name at the back.

d. Names and ages, grade and school attended by the members of the choir. This shall be certified by the school principal or head of the organization.

e. Name of choir leader/s, conductor, and accompanist.

f. A list of five or ten songs.

g. A copy of each of the contest repertoire (actual score) with lyrics and music with composer's name, excluding the regional and contest piece.

13. Membership to a choir is limited to those registered with the National secretariat.

FINAL 1976  
SPECIFIC RULES AND REGULATIONS FOR  
CHILDREN'S SONGS COMPETITION  
(refer to General Rules and Regulations)

1. Participants to the final competition are those approved by the OCF Board of Judges.

2. Final competition will be on November 28, 1976 at the OCF Main Theatre.

3. Prizes are as follows:

One (1) First Prize . . . . .	25,000.
Two (2) Second Prizes . . . . .	22,000 each
Three (3) Third Prizes . . . . .	11,000 each
Four (4) Fourth Prizes . . . . .	8,000 each

All participating choirs will receive a plaque or a certificate.

4. Accompaniment is limited to piano, however, songs may be sung a capella.

5. No child conductor is allowed. Conductors and accompanists can perform only with one choir.

6. Singing time for each choir is limited to eight (8) minutes, excluding the songs to be selected by the Board of Judges.

7. Song requirements:

a. The official final contest piece to be distributed August 30, 1976.

b. Foreign song (sung during the regional contest)

c. Filipino composition (sung during the regional contest).

d. One song to be selected by the Board of Judges from the submitted repertoire. The said song shall be selected immediately after the three songs have been sung.

8. All songs shall be memorized. No choreography and body movement is allowed.

9. Board and lodging in the final contest site will be provided by the National Secretariat for a period of seven (7) days (excluding Greater Manila Area contestants).

INSTRUM 1978  
SPECIFIED RULES AND REGULATIONS FOR  
10TH GRADE COMPETITION  
(Refer to General Rules and Regulations)

1. Participation in the competition is open to all existing high school choirs (school, church, community choirs, etc.)

2. Choir membership is limited to a maximum of 20 and a maximum of 40. Individual participation is limited to one choir only duly registered with the National Secretariat.

3. Accompaniment is limited to piano, however, songs may be sung a cappella.

4. Singing time for each choir is limited to eight (8) minutes.

5. Prizes are as follows:

One (1) First Prize . . . . .	₱1,000.00
One (1) Second Prize . . . . .	₱500.00
One (1) Third Prize . . . . .	₱300.00
Two (2) Consolation Prizes . . . . .	₱100.00 each

6. Song Requirements:

a. One required official contest piece (to be supplied by the CCP on July 15, 1978) shall not, in any manner, be rearranged.

b. One foreign song (three selection).

c. One Filipino song sung in any Filipino dialect.

d. The choir may sing the three songs in any order.

7. Music must be SSA (for lower high school), SAB, SAA, SAAB, SAAB depending on availability of tenors and basses (higher high school) or SSA for girls' choirs; SSS or TSS or SSS for boys' choirs.

8. All songs shall be memorized. No choreography or body movement is allowed.

9. No soloists are allowed; all solo parts are to be sung by the whole section called for.

10. Choirs joining the competition for the second time must have five additional songs in their repertoire. New choir applications organized at least twelve weeks before the competition must have at least five songs in their repertoire.

11. Participating choirs must submit the following to the Regional Secretariat:

a. Application form for the Region to be submitted on August 30, 1976 while the Greater Pacific Area is on September 30, 1976 (one copy to GPF and one copy to the Regional Secretariat).

b. Choir picture (black and white) glossy, size 7 x 5.

c. Conductor's picture 2 1/2 x 2 1/2, printed name at the back.

d. Name and year of each participant duly certified by the principal or head of the organization.

e. Name of choir, accompanist, leader/s and conductor.

f. A list of five or ten songs.

g. A copy each of the current repertoire (actual score) with lyrics and music with composer's name, excluding the Regional and national pieces.

1. The contest is open to all Filipino citizens who are students in piano residing anywhere in the Philippines.

2. Age Range:

Category A - any age not exceeding 11 years by December 1, 1976

Category B - age 12 but not exceeding 16 years by December 1, 1976

Category C - not over 30 years with a Bachelor of Science in Music degree

3. Deadline for submission of application forms is October 1, 1976.

4. Participant shall shoulder all expenses during his/her stay in Manila for the competition.

5. No abridged version or transcription of any music piece shall be performed during the competition.

6. Official contest piece: A commissioned Filipino composition available on September 1, 1976 at the CCP at cost.

7. Musical requirements for the competition are as follows:

Category A

a. Bach: one from Anna Magdalena Bach Book, one dance from a Bach suite, one Little Prelude, one Two-Part Invention.

b. Haydn: Sonata in C (one slow and one fast movement)

c. Mozart: Sonata K. 279 (one slow and one fast movement)

d. Beethoven: Sonata (one slow and one fast movement)

e. One romantic piece from:

Schumann: Album for the Young, or Scenes from Childhood.

Chopin: Waltz such as Minute Waltz

Mendelssohn: one piece from Songs without words.

Grieg album or any other composer belonging to the Romantic period.

f. One contemporary piece from:

1. The contest is open to all Filipino citizens.
2. Applicant shall report to the competition with his musical instrument.

3. Contest Category and Age Limits:

- B - Wind (oboe, flute, etc.)

SCIENTIFIC PIPES AND REGULATIONS FOR  
FAMILY ENSEMBLE COMPETITION  
(Refer to General Rules and Regulations)

1. The contest is open to all families of Filipino citizenship residing in the Philippines.

2. Participating Family Groups must have any of the following relationships:

- Vertical Relationship - at least two generations represented
- Horizontal Relationship - limited to a maximum of one degree.

Example:

- Vertical Relationship - great-grandfather

father  
son
- Horizontal Relationship - The member participant and his brother or his first degree cousin.

3. There should be no less than five nor more than 20 members in the group.

4. Birth certificate of each member in the group shall be submitted with the application.

5. Deadline for submission of application is Oct. 1, 1975.

6. Categories:

- A - Choral ensemble with or without accompaniment
- B - Mixed instrumental ensemble
- C - Bandlike ensemble

7. Repertoire: One foreign and one Filipino composition with a performance duration of not more than eight minutes for both categories.

8. Awards for each category:

- Second Prize . . . . . \$1,000
- Third Prize . . . . . \$500

9. Applicant may join upon recommendation from the National Executive Judication Committee.
