RECOGNITION DAY FOR ALAY TANIM-PROJECTS

To: Bureau Directors
Regional Directors
Chiefs of Services and Heads of Units
Coordinator, State Colleges and Universities
Schools Superintendents

1. In accordance with Department Memorandum No. 94, s. 1975 which set aside September 11 of each year as Recognition Day for Alay Tanim projects, all schools are urged to hold appropriate programs in observance of the day. This day has been set aside to acknowledge all efforts exerted by the school populace towards the attainment of the goals of Alay Tanim, namely: reforestation, food production, soil and water conservation and beautification.

2. A special feature of this year's celebration of Alay Tanim Recognition Day is the holding of Alay Tanim-contests at the division, regional and national levels.

3. The division contest should include all schools in all levels -- elementary, secondary and higher education. The division winner will be the school in the division getting the highest number of points, using the inclosed suggested criteria, and will be the participant in the regional contest. The regional winner will be the division getting the highest number of points. All regional winners will be the entries to the national contest.

4. The contest schedule follows:

June 1-30, 1976 - - - School division contest among the three levels of instruction.

July 1-31, 1976 - - - Regional contest among school division winners, not by levels.

August 1-31, 1976 - - National contest among regional winners.

5. Division and regional boards of judges will be organized by the offices concerned. The National Board of Judges is composed of:

6. The National board of judges will make on-the-spot evaluation of the regional entries. Traveling expenses of the Regional and National Boards of Judges will be charged against funds allocated for this project; for the National Board of Judges not exceeding P20,000 and each regional board not exceeding P2,000. It is suggested that the regional directors submit the regional division winners by wire not later than August 2, 1976. The report should be addressed to the Secretary of Education and Culture, Attn: Asst. Secretary Velasto Suarez and/or Mrs. Silvana C. Laya. Prizes will be awarded to national winners on September 11, 1976.

7. For uniformity, the suggested criteria for judging ALEX Spain projects, contained in paragraph 2 of Department Memorandum No. 100, s. 1976, should be used. A copy of said criteria is enclosed for ready reference.

SUGGESTED CRITERIA FOR JUDGING ALAY TANIU PROJECTS

September 11, 1978 should be designated Alay Taniu Recognition Day. A feature of the program should be the awarding of appropriate prizes and/or certificates of recognition for the best Alay Taniu Project and the people responsible for it. Suggested criteria for judging this project follows:
