18TH WORLD SCHOOL CHILDREN'S ART EXHIBITION

To: Bureau Directors
Regional Directors
Coordinator, State Colleges and Universities
Schools Superintendents

1. The Embassy of the Republic of Korea has announced the 18th World School Children's Art Exhibition from October 22, 1976 to June 30, 1977 at the Korean Children's Center, The Yook Young Foundation, Seoul, Korea and in other major cities of Korea, under the patronage of the Korean National Commission for UNESCO, Ministry of Culture and Information, and Ministry of Foreign Affairs.
2. To promote international understanding and friendship among children throughout the world and stimulate children's art education through exchange of art works, the Korean Children's Center, the sponsor of this exhibition, is inviting 50 to 60 elementary school children, aged 6 to 12 years, from each of the different countries of the world to participate.
3. Each participant is required to submit one art work (unframed), on any subject, in any of the following media: oil, water color, crayon, pastel, resin, printing work and collage. The maximum size is 35 cm. x 40 cm.
4. The first three best entries from each region must be sent direct to the Materials Production and Publication Division, Information and Publication Service, DEU, Manila, with the following information; printed in English and in capital letters, attached to the back of the mat of each entry: (a) full name of participant, (b) age and sex, (c) name and address of the school, and (d) title of the work. They must reach the Division on or before August 30, 1976, to enable the Screening Committee to choose the best entries for the exhibition.
5. A number of prizes, certificates of merits and medals will be awarded to the selected participants.

6. Works submitted shall not be returned and will be distributed to different schools in Korea. In exchange, the same number of Korean children's work will be sent to the school or club in each country by request.

7. Wide publicity of the content of this Department Memorandum is desired.
