ANNOUNCEMENT FOR THE 1976 NSDB UNDERGRADUATE SCIENCE SCHOLARSHIPS

I. GENERAL INFORMATION

A. Scholarships

The National Science Development Board shall award one hundred (100) scholarships to those who successfully compete in the 1976 NSDB National Scholarships Examination following an approved procedure of selection. The scholarships shall be in pursuance of the following courses:

- B.S. Agriculture
- B.S. Agricultural Chemistry
- B.S. Agricultural Engineering
- B.S. Agricultural Education
- B.S. Development Communication
- B.S. Forestry
- B.S. Fisheries
- B.S. Sugar Technology
- B.S. Biology
- B.S. Botany
- B.S. Zoology
- B.S. Biochemistry
- B.S. Food Technology
- B.S. Marine Biology
- B.S. Community Nutrition
- B.S. Chemistry
- B.S. Physics
- B.S. Geology
- B.S. Chemical Engineering
- B.S. Electrical Engineering
- B.S. Electronics Engineering
- B.S. Mechanical Engineering
- B.S. Metallurgical Engineering
- B.S. Mining Engineering
- B.S. Education major in Mathematics or Physics or Chemistry or Industrial Education
- B.S. Mathematics
- B.S. Statistics
- B.S. Anthropology
- B.S. Geography
- B.S. Hygiene
- Doctor of Veterinary Medicine

B. Qualifications of an applicant

1. Must be qualified for graduation from any public or authorized private high school in March 1976;
2. Must be classified within the range 27th of the graduating class;
3. Must be a natural-born citizen of the Philippines; and
4. Must be in good health: physically, mentally, emotionally, and morally.

C. Scholarship privileges per academic year

1. Actual tuition and other school fees as listed by the university where the scholar is enrolled;
2. Outright grant for prescribed textbooks and essential school supplies first and second years at P500.00 and subsequent years at P600.00;
3. Actual cost of Military Science and Physical Education uniforms not to exceed P200.00;
4. Free transportation for one secondary class round trip between the permanent residence and place of study; and
5. Monthly living allowance for 10-month duration based on the net taxable income of the parent/legal guardian of the awardee as follows:

Type of Scholarship	Net Taxable Income of Parents/Guardian	Monthly Living Allowance
Full	Below P6,000	P400.00
Partial	From P6,000 to P10,000	P250.00
Honorary	Above P10,000	P150.00

Additional allowances for the last two students if required such as:

1. Monthly living allowance according to the grade of scholarship;
2. Actual tuition and other school fees; and
3. Actual purchase of textbooks and essential supplies not to exceed P50.00.

D. Scholarship requirements

1. College placement: An awardee shall enroll at the University of the Philippines or in any other non-profit, non-stock university or college of recognized standing offering a complete course approved by the Department of Education and Culture and the NSDB.
2. An awardee shall not enjoy simultaneously with this science scholarship any other scholarship award.
3. Upon completion of his bachelor of science course an awardee shall serve in the country during his field of training. He shall serve to the NSDB and/or its agencies with due compensation for a continuous period equivalent to the length of time he enjoyed this scholarship.
4. Just the continuance of his scholarship until completion of a Bachelor of Science course, an awardee shall maintain the grade requirements of the scholarship.
5. An awardee shall comply with the terms of scholarship agreement to be entered between himself, parent/guardian and NSDB.

F. Items to be submitted

1. NSDB Information Sheet, one copy;
2. Certification from the high school principal on the following:
 - a. qualification for graduation in March 1976;
 - b. total number of graduating class; and
 - c. class rank in certification that the applicant belongs to the upper 25% of the graduating class;
3. A certified true copy of the income tax return filed by the parents or legal guardian for the year immediately preceding the filing of application, duly stamped received by the Bureau of Internal Revenue. In case parents/guardian is exempt from filing an income tax, an affidavit to this effect, subscribed and sworn to before the municipal treasurer of his municipality must be submitted.
4. Health certificate from a qualified physician; and
5. One 2" x 3" picture recently taken to be attached to the notice of admission.

F. All items to be submitted by the applicant must be received by the NSDB not later than December 10, 1975. Only applicants with complete papers fully accomplished shall be considered for participation in the 1976 NSDB Undergraduate Science Scholarships.

2. Application forms can be obtained from any of the NSDB Regional Offices and offices of the high school principals.

II. SELECTION

A. NSDB National Scholarships Examination

1. The applicant shall be notified in due time as to whether or not he is qualified for admission to the 1976 NSDB National Scholarships Examination to be held on January 31, 1976 (7:00 A.M. - 12:00 Noon).
2. The examinee shall defray from personal funds his subsistence and transportation expenses to and from the examination center;
3. The examination shall include the following:
 - (a) Test of General Mental Ability and (b) Aptitude Tests in Science, Mathematics and English.

B. The General Committee on the Selection and Assistance of Science Scholars as a body shall select one hundred (100) awardees on the basis of performance in the following:

1. 1976 NSDB National Scholarships Examination

2. National College Entrance Examination; and
 3. Qualifying examination for admission by the university he will enroll.
- C. The first 50 scholarship slots shall be awarded to candidates who will get the first 50 highest scores based on the national competitive examination, and the second 50 scholarship slots shall be awarded only to candidates from the eleven (11) regions of the country 14 or 3 slots for each region; who will get the highest scores in their respective regions, provided that such scores fall within the prescribed minimum acceptable scores.

D. The decision of the General Committee on the selection of awardees is final and unappealable.

Scholarships open to all qualified citizens of the Philippines regardless of whether natural born or naturalized.

C. Scholarships Privileges per Academic Year

Outright grant for prescribed textbooks and essential school supplies: first and second years at P400.00 and subsequent years at P500.00.

D. College Placement

An awardee shall enroll only in colleges and universities belonging to the accreditation system and/or duly certified by the Bureau of Higher Education.
