IMPLEMENTING THE ONE-DAY FEEDING COMMITMENT  
OF CARE/CRS SCHOOLS

To the: Regional Directors  
Schools Superintendents

1. All CARE feeding schools are expected to have started implementing their commitment to the one-day-a-week supplementary feeding (Department Memorandum No. 169, s. 1975); if they have not done this yet, they may start in February, 1976, or as in CRS schools, conduct a continuous 12-day feeding program to begin on March 1, 1976. Instead of nutrients, schools should serve snacks utilizing the products from school, home and community gardens. A list of suggested 500-calorie recipes is attached.
2. Where a school is both a CARE and an ANP school, the day/days on which the school will not serve CARE nutrients may be the feeding days for the ANP project. This serves to integrate the two programs as enjoined in Department Memorandum No. 334, s. 1975.
3. Local government and/or other agencies may be tapped for additional financial support for these feeding days to which the schools are committed. When no other sources are available, and provided, however, that such appropriation shall not unduly prejudice other activities under R.A. No. 5447, Superintendents and district supervisors, who are chairman of local school boards, may request funding from the Special Education Fund (Department Memorandum No. 206, s. 1975).

4. The regional directors and division superintendents are requested to see that the above-mentioned commitment is fulfilled strictly. A report on the implementation of the One-Day Feeding Commitment of CARE/CBS Schools should be submitted to this Office not later than March 31, 1976.
