MEMORANDERI CIRCULAR

: ALL HEADS OF DEPARTMENTS, BUREAUS AND AGENCIES OF NATIONAL AND LOCAL SOVERNMENTS INCLUDING GOVERNMENT-OWNED AND CONTROLLED CORPORATIONS

COBJECT : Implementation of Protested Appointments

It has been observed that some appointing officials or heads of agencies of the national and local government including government-owned or controlled corporations, for some reason or another <u>defer</u> or hold in absymble the implementation of contested appointments by withholding the release of such appointments to the appointment or withholding the payment of their sulary although the appointess have assumed the duties of their positions and even after their eppointments have been approved by the Civil Service Commission.

In this cornection, attention is invited to Section 10. Rule III. and Section 10. Rule V. of Civil Service Rules on Personnel Actions and Policies, respectively, which provide as follows:

"An appointment issued in accordance with pertinent laws and rules shall take effect immediately upon its issuance by the appointing authority, and if the appointee has assumed the duties of the position, he shall be entitled to receive his relary at once without awaiting the approval of his appointment by the Commission. The appointment shall remain effective until disapproved by the Commission." (Section 10, Rule III)

"x x x x A contested appointment shall take effect immediately upon its issuance if the appointment assumes his duties immediately. However, the appointment, together with the decision of the Department head on the Office of the President, shall be submitted to the Commission for appropriate action within eixty (60) days from its issuance, otherwise the appointment becomes ineffective thereafter." (Section 10, Rule V)

Pursuant to the foregoing provisions, contested appointment takes effect immediately upon its issuance by the appointing authority or official provided that the appointes assumes the duties of his position, and the appointed is entitled to receive the salary

attached to his position even before the appointment is approved by the Civil Service Commission. And such appointment may be Eproposed by the Civil Service Commission pending fital outcome of the protest. In this connection, Memorandum Circular No. 13, series of 1975, of this Commission specifically states that the date of issue of an appointment shall refer to the date opposition, on the face of an appointment.

In view of the foregoing, it is hereby directed that after the issuance of the appointment, the appointment should be allowed to assume the duties of the position and paid his salary immediately without writing for the approval of his appointment, rending final outcome of the protest. After approval, said appointment should be released to the appointment immediately.

This Memorandum shall take offcot immediately.
