AVAILABILITY OF LOCAL NORMS OF FOREIGN MADE
PSYCHOLOGICAL ASSESSMENT MATERIALS

To: Bureau Directors
Regional Directors
Coordinator, State Colleges and Universities

1. The Child and Youth Research Center, Department of Education and Culture, has developed local norms of some foreign made psychological tests for Filipino children and youth.
2. These psychological tests are used to assess intelligence and personality. They can help children and youth in maximizing their potentials for growth and development. These materials are as follows:

Personality Tests

a. Barrreuter Personality Inventory (BPI)

Designed to measure six aspects of personality at one administration.

Range: High school and above. Time: 30 minutes
Scoring: Hand and machine

b. 16 Personality Factors (16 P.F.)

Widely used, well-researched objective measure of 16 personality traits. Easily administered and rapidly scored.

Range: 17 to mature adults Time: 35-40 minutes
Scoring: Hand

c. High School Personality Questionnaire (H.S.P.Q.)

Widely used standardized test which measures 14 distinct dimensions of personality in children: can help predict school achievement, vocational fitness, danger of delinquency, leadership, and need for clinical help.

Range: 11 to 18 years old Time: 40 to 50 minutes
Scoring: Hand

d. Children's Personality Questionnaire (C.P.Q.)

Widal's used personality test for children. Consists of 19 scales which approach total personality. Aids in the prediction of underachievement, delinquency, leadership, and potential needs for clinical help for emotional disturbances.

Range: 8 to 12 years old Time: 50 minutes
Scoring: Hand

e. Tennessee Self-Concept Scale

TSCS was developed by the Tennessee Department of Mental Health in 1958. The scale consists of 100 self-descriptive statements which the subject uses to picture himself. There are 10 sub-scales.

Range: 12 to 26 years old
Time: 10 to 20 minutes. Scoring: Hand

Intelligence Tests.

a. Ravens Progressive Matrices

A non-verbal test series designed to aid in assessing mental ability by requiring the examinee to solve problems in abstract figures and designs.

Range: 8 to 65 years old
Time: untimed above 45 minutes Scoring: Hand

b. Chicago Non-Verbal Test

This test is designed specifically for children who are handicapped in the use of English language, who are deaf and are having reading difficulty.

Range: 8 to adult Time: 40 to 50 minutes
Scoring: Hand

c. Kuhlmann-Anderson Test

Measure of general learning ability or academic potential.

Range: Kindergarten through Grade 12.
Time: 50-60 minutes Scoring: Hand

3. The aforementioned psychological assessment materials may be used by guidance counselors and teachers. They are available for direct orders at the Philippine Psychological Corporation, 11th Floor, Insular Life Building, Ayala Avenue, Makati, Rizal at a very minimal cost. The local norms for Filipino children and youth are available also for direct order at the Child and Youth Research Center, Department of Education and Culture, Keymanong Press Building, 940 Quezon Avenue, Quezon City at the minimal cost of five pesos (P5.00) for each norm. Purchases may be charged to office appropriation subject to the usual accounting and auditing regulations.

4. All schools and other institutions of learning are encouraged to make use of the materials.
