IMPLEMENTATION OF THE ACCREDITATION
AND EQUIVALENCE PROGRAM (AEP)

To: Bureau Directors
Regional Directors
Coordinator, State Colleges and Universities
Schools Superintendents
Regional/Division Testing Coordinators

1. The Accreditation and Equivalence Program (AEP) of the Department of Education and Culture will be initially implemented during the second semester of the school year 1977-1978. Attention in this connection is invited to the Rules and Regulations for the Implementation of the Accreditation and Equivalence Program inclosed with Department Memorandum No. 211, s. 1977.
2. All personnel directly involved in the implementation of the AEP are held responsible for safeguarding the security of all classified materials, i.e., the tests, in order to maintain the integrity of the program.
3. As indicated in Rule II, Section J of the inclosure to the aforementioned Department Memorandum, the following are the clientele who would be served by the program:
 - a. Those who dropped out of school for one year or more;
 - b. Those who dropped out of school and intermittently enrolled but did not finish any grade/year;
 - c. Those who have not gone to school at all; and
 - d. Those who are presently in school but are overaged for their particular grade/year level and are recommended by the school authorities to take the Philippine Educational Placement Test (PEPT).
4. The student-applicants should accomplish the Registration Form (copy inclosed) in triplicate. The original copy should be submitted to the Regional Testing Center, the duplicate should be retained by the Division Testing Center, and the triplicate copy shall be sent to the METC, Department of Education and Culture, Manila.

5. Registration starts on November 1 and ends on December 31, 1977. Regional Testing Centers should advise the RETC of the total number of examinees in their respective regions on the first week of January, 1978.

6. Attention is further invited to Paragraph 4 of Department Order No. 32, s. 1977, on the organization of a Regional Testing Center with security provisions, and the formation of the Mobile Team that will administer the EPT in the various Division testing centers. Rule IV, Section 5 of the inclosure to Department Memorandum No. 211, s. 1977, has also been revised in that each applicant shall accomplish three copies of the Registration Form instead of just one copy.

7. Other sample forms inclosed are those for the examination permit and the AET Work Schedule.

8. It is requested that the contents of this Department Memorandum be immediately disseminated.


