**SELECTION OF SCIENCE AND TECHNOLOGY KITS FOR THE
SCHOOL SCIENCE EQUIPMENT PROJECT**

To: Regional Directors
Schools Department

1. The National Science Development Board, in coordination with the Department of Education and Culture, the UP Science Education Project, the UT College of Engineering and the Educational Development Projects Implementing Task Force (EDPITAF) has initiated a five-year project on the improvement of science education at the elementary level through the provision of school science kits. The project hopes to help solve the problem of insufficient or total lack of science equipment.
2. Since the science kits complement the new textbooks prepared by the UP-SEDP, the project proponent and the cooperating agencies plan to distribute the science kits simultaneously with the textbooks at the start of classes in June, 1978.
3. Agreement was reached on the provision of the school science kits to public elementary schools as this group absorbs the greater bulk of the total school population with very little or no money to spend on the purchase of equipment and teaching aids, especially for science teaching.
4. The project gives priority to those schools with incomplete offerings (Grades I-V only). This is to give preference to school planning to be maximized effectively.
5. Four thousand one hundred eighty-eight (4,188) incomplete schools and one thousand eight hundred twelve (1,812) complete schools (with Jr Sec T.V.I) offerings have been identified as the first recipients of the school science

- kits. The selection will be based on the proximity of schools to RDCs and UNDP/IFL warehouses to facilitate distribution and monitoring of L-Block one on the priority given to incomplete schools. The L-Block material will be distributed to incomplete schools for the school to earn equivalent points.
6. Attached is a tentative list of schools to be selected in the region for no timeliness. If, regional director is given the power over to change the school/s which fail to meet the criterion of timeliness to RDC or UNDP/IFL warehouses.
7. The number of incomplete or incomplete schools selected in the final listing shall not exceed the total number indicated. However, when the number of incomplete schools cannot be met based on the timeliness criterion, complete schools may be selected up to the number allocated to the region.
8. The revised listing of L-Block recipient schools should be submitted to the Bureau of Elementary Education not later than March 30, 1996. Immediate attention and compliance with this is therefore requested.
