ALLOTMENTS ON TRAVEL, MEDICINES AND MEDICAL  
SUPPLIES FOR PUBLIC HEALTH NURSES

To: Bureau Directors  
Regional Directors  
Coordinator, State Colleges and Universities  
Schools Superintendents

1. For the information and guidance of the field, BPS Circular No. 11, s. 1965 and BPS General Letter No. 138, dated August 2, 1967, copies of which are hereby inclosed, have not been rescinded.
2. Conformably to the provisions of the aforementioned regulations, it is desired that all superintendents/school administrators earmark at least 10% of the division/vocational schools allotments on supplies and materials and/or equipment for the purchase of medicines which are direly needed in safeguarding the health of approximately eight million school children throughout the country.
3. To further improve essential health services in the schools, it is directed that every schools superintendent/administrator also provide funds for travel and medical supplies for public health nurses from the aforementioned allotments of the school.
4. Schools superintendents/administrators are therefore enjoined to take immediate steps towards the implementation of the foregoing provisions.
5. A quarterly report on the implementation of this directive is desired.

MEMORANDUM for -

The Director of Public Schools

1. In majority of cases, it has been observed that Programs of Expenditures being submitted to this Office during the current fiscal year do not bear any provision for highly essential items particularly medicines which are direly needed in safeguarding the health of approximately four million school children throughout the country.

2. In view hereof, this Office requests that henceforth, Division Superintendent of Schools be directed to earmark at least 10% out of their allotment for Supplies and Materials and/or Equipment for medicines.

3. This Order is an exception to the provisions of Department Order No. 12, s. 1964 of this Office which eliminates the percentage of allotment for any particular area in the programming of expenditures.

Dear Sir:

It has come to the attention of this Office that some schools have no supplies of medicines needed for treatment of minor ailments and injuries despite the issuance of Circular No. 11, s. 1965, which provides for the purchase of such supplies. The situation must not be allowed to continue.

It is therefore reiterated that every school superintendent earmark in his program of expenditures at least 10% of the total allotment for supplies and materials for his division for the purchase of medicines and medical supplies conformably to the aforesaid Circular No. 11.
