FESTIVAL OF PHILIPPINE INVENTIONS

1. In observance of the Annual Inventors Week, the Philippine Inventors Commission will hold an exhibit called "Festival of Philippine Inventions" on April 12-18, 1978 at Philcite, Metro Manila.
2. The objectives of the exhibition are: to provide a venue where inventors can exhibit and demonstrate their inventions and to promote awareness of science and technology as basic tools for national development and of invention as a purposeful force in the acceleration of techno-economic growth.
3. To encourage people to view the exhibits, the following incentives are offered:
 - a. Admission to the exhibit is free.
 - b. Raffles will be held in the afternoons with invention items as prizes to lucky holders of raffle tickets worth P0.50. Tickets will be sold in different places in Greater Manila and at the exhibit area in Philcite.
 - c. Local and foreign films on science and technology will be shown daily at the festival site from 8:00-11:00 p.m.
 - d. A grand raffle will be held at the end of the festival with a refrigerator, a colored TV set, a stereo set, etc., as prizes.

c. Demonstrations will be conducted by Techno-bus.

4. In view of the importance of the activity as a strategy in cultivating an interest in local inventing, it is desired that youths, children in all levels of school and their parents and all others be urged to view the exhibits.

5. Immediate dissemination of this Department Memorandum is desired.
