THREE-WEEK SEMINAR/LEADERSHIP COURSE
FOR SCHOOL HEALTH GUARDIANS

To: Bureau Directors
Regional Directors
Coordinator, State Colleges and Universities
Schools Superintendents

1. The Baguio Vacation Normal School (BVNS), Teachers Camp, Baguio City, in cooperation with the School Health and Nutrition Center (SHNC) is offering a three-week seminar/leadership course for school health guardians, a workshop in the preparation of Self-Learning Materials and Resource Units and a seminar in Educational Media from April 17 to May 6, 1978.
2. These courses aim to (a) improve the health of the school children, (b) develop the teacher's concern for the total health development of the child, and (c) develop leadership among the supervisory staff, particularly those at the regional level.
3. These courses entitle the participants to a certificate if taken as non-credit, or may be credited in terms of units as electives at the graduate level.
4. Each region may send four participants to attend the courses. These participants should have the following assignments: (a) supervisor/coordinator in charge of health, (b) supervisor/coordinator in charge of school feeding, (c) supervisor/coordinator in charge of environmental education, and (d) supervisor/coordinator in charge of alay tanim. Participants should not be more than 55 years old.
5. The participants should bring along with them copies of modules and/or self-learning kits and resource units on health and environmental education and scrapbooks on local medicinal plants, herbs and flowers if they have any in their division.
6. Board and lodging of participants at Teachers Camp, tuition and miscellaneous fees at the BVNS, will be paid by the SHNC, subject to the usual accounting and auditing rules and regulations. Transportation expenses to and from Baguio will be sent to the respective regional offices. It is understood that the most economical means of transportation will be used by the participants (economy class boat

fare for those from the Visayas and Mindanao, train fare from Bicol provinces and regular bus fare from Manila to Baguio). The participants from Luzon will be entitled to regular bus fare from their respective stations to Baguio. No per diems will be paid to participants inasmuch as the board and lodging are free.

7. It is requested that the names of the nominees be submitted to the Department of Education and Culture, Arroceros St., Manila, not later than March 20, 1979.
