SCRAPBOOK CONTEST

To: Bureau Directors  
Regional Directors  
Coordinator, State Colleges and Universities  
Schools Superintendents

1. In cooperation with the Women's Rights Movement of the Philippines, the Department of Education and Culture announces a scrapbook contest for students of public, private and vocational secondary schools and members of out-of-school youth clubs.
2. The contest aims at focusing attention on the achievements of unknown heroines and outstanding women in any barrio, town, province or city of the country. It will be undertaken in connection with the organization's "Honor Our Outstanding Women" recognition project.
3. The bureau directors, regional directors, coordinator of state colleges and universities, schools superintendents and the division educational media supervisors are enjoined to coordinate to ensure the success of the contest.
4. Inclosed are the rules of the contest.
5. The cooperation of all concerned is earnestly solicited.

WOMEN'S RISING MOVEMENT OF THE PHILIPPINES  
SCRAPBOOK CONTEST

A. Contents and Preparation

- I - The division superintendents shall organize a committee in the division for the screening of their Division entries to be submitted to the regional office.
- II . The regional director in turn shall organize a committee which will screen the regional entries to be submitted to the Office of the Undersecretary for Non-Formal Education.
- III . The Undersecretary for Non-Formal Education shall in turn form a committee which shall determine the winners of the contest. Selection of winners must conform with the following guidelines:
  1. Each scrapbook, measuring 28 cms. x 30 cms. shall consist of a minimum of six (6) biographies of outstanding women who have not been recognized as such, living or deceased, in the province, city, town or barrio where the individual or participant group is a resident.
  2. Every biography submitted may illustrate outstanding work such as:
    - a. High moral values as exemplified by her own home and family life.
    - b. High degree of civic mindedness, manifested by active participation in educational, social, religious, civic, cultural, economic and other humanitarian endeavors.
    - c. Patriotic and heroic deeds.
    - d. Achievements in her profession/vocation that have contributed not only to her own personal or her family's development and progress, but also to the development of the community where she resides.
    - e. Contribution to the effective implementation of the Administration's new thrusts towards the achievement of the goals of the New Society.
  3. The outstanding work should be supported by several or all of the following:
    - a. Anecdotes
    - b. Sketches and other art work
    - c. Photographs
    - d. Testimonials
    - e. "ments
    - f. Clippings
    - g. Other pertinent documents

4. The contest involves individual and group effort of "in-school" and "out-of-school" youth groups in the secondary school age level.
5. Entries may be written in or in English or Filipino.
6. Creative arrangement of materials in the scrapbook is left to the participants. Use of local materials in any way is encouraged.

E. Timetable

Preliminary Competition

1. The screening committee shall be composed of the division superintendent of schools as Chairman, a superintendent of a vocational school as Co-Chairman with the home economics supervisor, industrial arts and media supervisors as members. They are authorized to plan out the screening of their division entries and to submit selected entries to the office of the regional director on or before December 31, 1973.
2. The regional director is authorized to organize a committee which will screen the regional entries. All entries selected on the regional level should be submitted either personally or by mail on or before January 31, 1974 to the Office of the Undersecretary for Non-Formal Education, DBC, who is the Chairman. A committee from the Department of Education and Culture which is composed of representatives from the DBC, DLGCD, DSSD, DOL, and the DOH, shall be designated to determine the winners of this contest.

F. National Competition

- a. Deadline for submission of regional entries shall be January 31, 1974.
- b. Announcement of winners will be on February 6, 1974.
- c. Prizes will be awarded on February 14, 1974 with the appropriate ceremony.

G. Prizes

Prizes will be:

- 1st Prize - ₱2,000 and a trophy
- 2nd Prize - ₱1,000 and a trophy
- 3rd Prize - ₱ 500 and a trophy

All regional and national entries will be given a laminated certificate each.

D. Criteria for Selection

Primary consideration in judging entries shall be:

E. Other Details

1. The decision of the Board of Judges in the national competition shall be final.
2. All entries submitted to the National Competition Committee shall become the property of the Women's Rights Movement of the Philippines.
