TIPID MOVEMENT SCHOOL INCENTIVE AWARDS FOR THE
MOST EFFECTIVE INCOME GENERATING PROJECT

To: Bureau Directors

and Universities

1. In line with the TIPID Movement and the National Commission on Savings, school children and students are encouraged not only to save but also to work on projects that will generate income for them. The habit of saving can be further developed if children become deeply involved in production-oriented and income-generating projects.
2. The National Commission on Savings through the joint efforts of the Central Bank of the Philippines and the Ministry of Education and Culture is launching a program of giving TIPID incentive awards to elementary, general secondary and vocational-technical high schools having the most effective income-generating projects for the school year 1978-1979. In this connection, contests will be held on the regional, division and district levels.
3. All elementary schools, general secondary schools, and vocational-technical high schools, therefore, are enjoined to strengthen and/or put up more income generating projects such as: handicraft, bamboo craft, shell craft, poultry raising, piggery, vegetable gardens, fish culture, etc.
4. Awards of the winning school projects will be given by the Central Bank of the Philippines.

5. Enclosed are the implementing rules for the TUPID Movement School Incentive Awards and a sample of the prescribed entry form.

6. Immediate dissemination of the contents of this MEC Memorandum is desired.

**NATIONWIDE TIPID MOVEMENT
SCHOOL INCENTIVE AWARD PROGRAM**

Rules and Regulations

1. The 1976-79 Nationwide TIPID Movement School Incentive Award Program is a plan of the National Commission on Savings designed to reward schools with the most effective income generating project. The program is open to all elementary, general secondary and vocational-technical secondary schools, both public and private, on local, provincial and regional levels.

2. The award program will be managed at the different levels by committees consisting of three members whose compositions shall be as follows:

Regional:

Chairman - DEC Regional Director
Members - a representative each from the local bankers and barangay leaders

Provincial:

Chairman - Provincial Superintendent of Schools
Members - a representative each from the local bankers and barangay leaders

Municipal:

Chairman - DEC District Supervisor
Members - a representative each from the local bankers and barangay leaders

The Chairmen for each committee shall request the head of the local bankers association and the mayor to designate a representative coming from the bankers and barangay leaders, respectively. In an

automatically be a member of the committee. In a municipality where there is no bank, the Chairman may request the bank or bankers association, as the case may be, in the neighboring town to designate a representative. Should this not be feasible, the Municipal Treasurer or the Municipal Secretary, in that order, shall automatically sit in the committee in place of the bank representative.

For purposes of this program, 1st and 2nd class cities shall be considered provinces and 3rd, 4th and 5th class cities shall be classified as municipalities.

3. The committee will choose a winner on the municipal level from each of the following category of schools:

- a. Elementary
- b. General Secondary
- c. Vocational-technical secondary

4. The winners on the municipal level will compete by category of schools for the prize on the provincial level.

5. Following the same procedure, the provincial winners will compete for the regional prize.

6. Winning schools of the three categories at the municipal and provincial levels shall be awarded certificates and plaques of merit, respectively. Winners in the regional level shall be awarded any or a combination of the following school supplies the total cost of which shall not exceed Three Thousand Pesos (P3,000.00):

- Globe 2 ft. diameter
- Philippine map, wall type
- World map, wall type
- English-Pilipino dictionaries
- English dictionaries
- Children's Encyclopedias

7. Schools engaged in any income generating projects, whether producing goods or services getting the highest number of points in accordance with the approved criteria for each of the three levels shall be declared winners. These projects, which may be undertaken within or outside the school premises, include, but are not necessarily be limited to, the following:

8. The projects shall be judged in accordance with the following

Weights

30%

a. Effectiveness to generate income

The project with the highest rate of return on investment is very effective in generating income. All or part of the profit is deposited in the bank. In case only a part is deposited in the bank the other part is reinvested in the project.

- b. Utilization of local or native materials 20%

The project utilizes as major components local materials. However, imported materials preferably in the form of discarded materials, recycled items, etc. may also be used.

- c. Extent and degree of pupil participation 20%

The project is participated in actively by the most number of pupils in relation to total school population

- d. Originality and Novelty 15%

The project is original, or if based on an old idea should manifest innovations for improvement and effectiveness.

- e. Sustained activities for a continuing project 15%

The project is a continuing one which will run for at least one school year.

9. Participants in the Award Program shall display a sign or notice of participation at a conspicuous place at the site of the project. The sign, on a piece of board or tin plate at least 1/2 x 1 meter in size shall bear the following:

The name of the project should be clearly indicated in the space provided in the entry form. Entry forms may be obtained from any of the following:

- a. Office of the District Supervisor
- b. Office of the School Superintendent

10. The timetable for the selection of the most effective income-generating project for various levels of the program and the submission of the report thereon shall be as follows:

- a. Municipal level - December 1-15, 1978
- b. Provincial level - January 1-15, 1979
- c. Regional level - February 1-14, 1979

The Municipal Committee shall submit its report to the Chairman of the Provincial Committee who, in turn shall submit his report to the Chairman, Regional Committee. Finally, the report of the Regional Committee shall be submitted to the Office of the Secretary, Department of Education and Culture not later than February 26, 1979.

11. The Municipal and Provincial Committees shall decide the winners at their respective levels. Copies of the pertinent papers concerning the contest shall be forwarded to the Central Bank Committee on Savings, thru the DEC, (Attention: Bureau of Elementary Education), as soon as the winners are declared but not more than five (5) days after such declaration.

12. The DEC will, with the concurrence of the Central Bank of the Philippines, declare the final regional winners each in the elementary general secondary, vocational-technical high school levels upon recommendation of the Regional Committee.

The award ceremony shall be held on March, 1978, the date and place to be announced later.
