BVNS 1979 TEACHER EDUCATION SUMMER CLASSES

To: Bureau Directors
Regional Directors
Coordinator, State Colleges and Universities
Schools Superintendents

1. The 1979 Baguio Teacher Education Normal School (BVNS), Teachers Camp, Baguio City will operate from April 16 to May 26, 1979.
2. For the information and guidance of all concerned, listed hereunder are the programs on the graduate and undergraduate levels that will be offered:
 - a. Master of Arts in Education with major in Educational Management (School Administration and Supervision), Educational Media, Adult and Community Education, Guidance and Counseling, Communication Arts (English or Filipino), Social Studies Education, Science Education, Mathematics Education, Music Education, Functional Literacy, Special Education, Home Economics and Volunteer Management
 - b. Master of Arts in Teaching (MAT) with fields of concentration in Pre-Elementary Education, School Health Education, Social Studies Education, Home Economics and Physical Education
 - c. Seminar/Leadership courses which will entitle the participants to a certificate (if taken in non-credit), or which may be credited in terms of units as electives at the graduate level or towards a field of concentration. These are two-to three-week courses intended to provide in-service training with relevance to the current major thrusts in the educational system for teachers and school officials in the different parts of our country. The regional offices should send at least one participant to each seminar course with travel and school expenses chargeable against local funds.
 - d. Courses on Functional Literacy of Ethnic Minorities, a consortium between the MEC and the Summer Institute of Linguistics, which will entitle the participants to a

certificate (if taken as non-credit) or which may be credited in terms of units as electives on the graduate level or towards a field of concentration.

- e. Special courses (undergraduate) in Music Education, Art Education, Physical Education or any field of concentration offered at the graduate level.

The subject offerings listed in Inclosure No. 2 of this Memorandum for each of the programs are subject to change depending on the priority needs of graduating students, the availability of qualified instructors, and the number of students who will enroll in a class to warrant its organization.

3. School officials, classroom teachers and other employees from public schools, upon recommendation of their superintendents, may take special undergraduate, graduate or summer/leadership courses at the Baguio Vacation Normal School. Government school personnel may be allowed traveling expenses and/or per diems chargeable against local funds, subject to the usual accounting and auditing regulations.

b. Teachers, school officials and other employees not in the government service, who desire to enroll in the courses offered in the BVNS should be recommended by their respective offices or institutions. Inclosure No. 1 to this Memorandum gives the general requirements and other pertinent information for enrollment in vacation classes.

5. To facilitate the smooth operation of these forthcoming vacation classes, teacher-students who plan to enroll at the BVNS this summer are requested to accomplish the attached form for advanced registration (Inclosure No. 3). This is to be sent to the National Research and Development Centre for Teacher Education, Ministry of Education and Culture, Arroceros St., Manila.

GENERAL REQUIREMENTS FOR ENROLMENT
AND OTHER INFORMATION

- 1 Registration for enrolment at the BVNS will be from April 2 to 14, 1979. Advanced registration by mail using the prescribed form (Inclosure No. 3) will be accepted. A fine not exceeding five pesos (P5.00) will be imposed on enrollees who enroll after the scheduled enrolment period. No student will be admitted after the first week of classes.
- 2 Teacher-students seeking admission at the BVNS for the first time should submit a duly accomplished application form together with his/her transcript of records as a prerequisite to permanent enrolment.
- 3 The fees to be charged are as follows:

4. Classes will be held 6 days a week, Monday through Saturday, one period of 60 minutes daily will be scheduled for each 2-unit course, 90 minutes for each 3-unit course, and 145 minutes for each course requiring laboratory experiences.
5. The maximum study load for either the undergraduate or the graduate level is nine (9) units in accordance with DPS Circular No. 7, s. 1973. Graduate students not carrying the full load may enroll for credit in special undergraduate courses provided that the total number of units shall not exceed nine (9) units. Those who take the full study load are allowed to enroll in one non-credit course.

Students enrolled in government schools/teacher's colleges may enrol at the BVMS for vacation classes. They should present to the registrar of the BVMS their Transcript of Records or Students' Permanent Record duly accomplished and signed by the registrar of the school, teacher's colleges and universities where they are enrolled during the regular school year.
