AUTHORIZING GOVERNMENT OFFICES TO BECOME
MEMBERS OF THE WORLD SAFETY ORGANIZATION

To: Bureau Directors
Regional Directors

1. Enclosed is a copy of Memorandum Circular No. 999 of the Office of the President of the Philippines authorizing government offices to become members of the World Safety Organization (WSO). The WSO, an international organization with its headquarters in Metro Manila, is introducing in the country a new discipline in line with the national effort to maximize the utilization of production, namely: people, equipment, material, capital, time, and environment.
2. The WSO, which is holding the Third World Safety and Accident Prevention Congress (WOSAPCON) in Buenos Aires from September 27 to October 3, 1980, is offering free live-in participation for one participant from each member-institution in the international executive course held once a year. The membership fee of each member-institution is P1,000 per annum, subject to the availability of funds and the usual accounting and auditing requirements.
3. It may be mentioned, in this connection, that membership to the WSO means a gain every year of one safety practitioner who will be exposed and trained in the systematic, intentional and highly professional management action directed to risk avoidance, loss prevention, loss reduction and the elimination of the pure risks of business, a few of which are accidents, property liability, fires, drug addiction, and other forms of wastages.

4. Bureaus and offices as well as schools, colleges, and universities are hereby enjoined to become members of the NSO and share in its laudable projects and overall objective which is: "Make Safety a Way of Life."

5. Immediate dissemination of the contents of this Memorandum is hereby requested.



MEMORANDUM CIRCULAR NO. 999

AUTHORIZING GOVERNMENT OFFICES TO BECOME MEMBERS OF
THE WORLD SAFETY ORGANIZATION (WSO)

The World Safety Organization (WSO), an international organization with its headquarters in Metro-Manila, is introducing into the country a new discipline in line with the national effort to maximize the utilization of production, namely: people, equipment, material, capital, time and environment. This is the discipline of total loss control and safety management which is the systematic, intentional and highly professional management action directed to risk avoidance, loss prevention and loss reduction and the elimination of the pure risks of business, a few of which are accidents, absenteeism, property liability, damages, alcoholism, drug addiction, illness, and other forms of wastages.

To the government, total loss control management means reduced operating costs, reduced capital, reduced replacement costs, reduced manpower turnover, job satisfaction, high employee morale, reduced industrial action, improved motivation and maximum service and profits.

All heads of departments, chiefs of bureaus and offices, as well as government-owned or controlled corporations, are hereby authorized to become members of the WSO by contributing the amount of one thousand pesos (P1,000) each per annum, subject to the availability of funds and the usual accounting and auditing requirements.
