1979 CONFERENCE OF SCHOOLS SUPERINTENDENTS

To: Bureau Directors  
Regional Directors  
Chiefs of Services and Heads of Units  
Coordinator, State Colleges and Universities  
Schools Superintendents

1. The 1979 Conference of Schools Superintendents will be held from April 17 to 24 at Teachers Camp, Baguio City. The theme of the conference is "Education and the National Job-Creation Program."
2. Only schools superintendents are authorized to attend the entire conference. Assistant superintendents and all other members of the Philippine Association of Schools Superintendents (PASSE) are authorized to attend on April 20-24.
3. Inclosed is the tentative program for the conference, as well as a list of committee members and conference officials.
4. It is desired that every superintendent bring with him the following to be submitted during registration:
  - a. Profile of the division including, among other things, the latest statistics on teachers, enrolment, literacy rates, school buildings, dropout rates, etc. utilizing the inclosed format.
  - b. Brief report on accomplishment of the division for the year.
  - c. List of activities/projects in the division supportive of the "National Job-Creation Program" as suggested in MEC Memorandum No. 310, s. 1978, with appropriate write-ups.
  - d. Administrative problems.
5. One plenary session will be devoted to Regional Accomplishment Reports which shall consist of either a summary of outstanding accomplishments in the region or reports of two or three outstanding







divisions. Each report should not exceed fifteen minutes. Regional directors are free to choose the form and style of presentation.

6. An added feature of this year's conference will be the panel displays or exhibits depicting accomplishments and other pertinent information including the regional profile. Panels will be provided for this purpose at the Quazon-Roosevelt Memorial Hall. The presentation will be on display for the duration of the conference.

7. When possible, regions may display samples of school products, equipment manufactured in schools or other technology from which other officials may draw ideas for their own programs.

8. A conference fee of P200 will be charged each participant. The conference fee and all travel expenses incident to attendance in this conference shall be charged to local funds, subject to the usual accounting and auditing rules and regulations.

9. Bureau and regional directors, bureau and regional assistant directors and chiefs of services will serve as consultants and resource persons in the group sessions.

10. Accommodations in Teachers Camp for the duration of the conference will be limited to participating superintendents and PAES Members. Those who may wish to bring their families will have to make the necessary arrangements for accommodation outside the camp.






