APPROPRIATIONS FOR NON-FORMAL EDUCATION  
FOR STATE COLLEGES AND UNIVERSITIES

To: Bureau Directors  
Regional Directors  
Coordinator, State Colleges and Universities  
Schools Superintendants

1. Cognizant of the overriding concern of the New Society to share the benefits of progress with the great masses of our people by improving the quality of life in the barangay, President Ferdinand E. Marcos issued LOI No. 606.
2. LOI No. 606 enjoins state colleges and universities to intensify their efforts in their present endeavors to transfer to the community their expertise, scientific and technological knowledge so that the barangays will be able to benefit from these.
3. These programs shall be monitored by the Ministry of Education and Culture through the Political Deputy Minister of Education and Culture In-Charge of Non-Formal Education and the regional directors.
4. Inclosed is a list of thirty-six (36) state universities and colleges with their approved Budgetary Appropriations for Non-Formal Education - CY 1979.
5. The approved budget for non-formal education shall be utilized by the school in organizing, expanding, and/or strengthening their own NFE programs in their institutions and communities.
6. Other state universities and colleges are reminded to include appropriations for Non-formal education in their budget request for CY 1980.
7. Immediate dissemination of the contents of this Memorandum to school officials concerned is desired.
