INTERNATIONAL CONTEST IN CHILDREN'S
DRAWINGS IN MOSCOW

1. An international contest in children's drawings, in connection with the 1980 Olympic Games will open on July 1, 1980 at the hall of the Academy of Arts of the USSR in Moscow. An invitation to participate in this contest has been extended to Filipino children aged 5-16 years.


2. The theme of the drawings should be on "I See the World". Inclosed are rules and regulations governing the contest.

3. In this connection, school divisions are requested to encourage as many children as possible to join the contest which is aimed at popularizing Olympic ideals, promoting goodwill and understanding among children of the world, and developing artistic talents.

4. The children participating in the contest should send their art works not later than September 1979 to "Pionerskaya Pravda," 21 Suschevskaya Street, Moscow R-30, USSR.

5. Dissemination of the contents of this Memorandum is requested.

RULES COVERING THE CHILDREN'S DRAWING CONTEST IN
CONNECTION WITH THE 1980 OLYMPIC GAMES IN MOSCOW

1. The drawing should be made by children aged 5-16 years without the assistance of adults.
2. Each participant should send no more than 10 drawings. Schools and organizations should send no more than 50-60 drawings.
3. Art works may be done individually or collectively in pencil, crayons, water colors, gouache, Indian ink, etc. Also welcome are engravings, mosaic, monotints, appliques, collages, batiks.
4. There are no restrictions as to the size of the drawings.
5. Subjects of drawings may vary without limit.
6. The following information should be indicated at the back of each drawing:
 - a) Title of the work
 - b) Name of the author
 - c) Date of Birth
 - d) Sex
 - e) Name of the teacher if the drawings are sent by school or by any other organization.
 - f) Country and exact address

Artistic works without the above information will not be accepted.

Entries should not be folded or rolled.

Artistic works will not be returned and will become the property of the sponsors who reserve the right for their further utilization.

9. Each participant of the exhibition will get a diploma, a catalogue and badges of the contest and the Olympic Games.
10. 200 authors will be awarded the commemorative medal of the contest.
11. 50 authors will get different prizes - works of applied art, books and albums on art, accessories for drawing and painting. Authors of the best drawings in the field of sports will be awarded special prizes by the Organizing Committee.
