CCP FILIPINO LITERATURE FESTIVAL

1. In line with the recent organization of the MEC-CCP Cultural Development Program and in recognition of the need to develop an awareness of the nation's cultural heritage among teachers and students, the Cultural Center of the Philippines, in celebration of its tenth anniversary, will hold a "Filipino Literature Festival."
2. To celebrate this festival, a Filipiniana Book Exhibit and Sale featuring the private Filipiniana rare book collection of Professor Leopoldo Yabes; the puppet collection and children's books of Professor Amelia Lapena; books from the CCP Library; the Acarna series of Mr. Virgilio Almario; and the book exhibit and sale put up by leading bookstores in Metro Manila will be opened to the general public at 10:00 A.M. on September 14, 1979 at the lobby of the CCP Little Theater.
3. The winning entries to the 1979 CCP Literary Contest will be awarded their respective prizes by the First Lady, Madame Imelda Romualdez-Marcos. Ceremonies are to be held at the Buwiwagang Gantimpala. Inclosed is a list of the winning entries.
4. To cap the festival, a three-day lecture series on the theme, "The Filipino Experience As Reflected in Literature" will be held starting September 14 from 2:00 to 4:00 P.M., at the CCP Little Theater. On the succeeding days, September 15 and 16, the lectures will take place from 9:00 A.M. to 4:00 P.M. The Programme for the lecture series is also inclosed.
5. Attendance at this festival is encouraged. Supervisors of English and Filipino; instructors/professors of English and Filipino, the Humanities, Mass Communication; student-teachers majoring

in English/Pilipino Literature and those who are enrolled in the Humanities and Mass Communication courses are enjoined to attend the lecture series.

6. Schools and offices concerned should arrange schedules to allow attendance at this lecture series. To facilitate arrangements for the lecture series and certification of attendance, interested schools should send a list of participants to the Bureau of Higher Education, Attention: Dr. Corazon A. Esclabanan. For further details on the festival, please contact the Festival Coordinator, Prof. Priscilla B. Dacanay at the CCP, telephone No. 57-39-61.
