1979-1980 TIPID MOVEMENT INCENTIVE AWARDS

To: Bureau Directors
Regional Directors
Schools Superintendents
Presidents, State Colleges and Universities
Boards of Private Schools, Colleges
and Universities

1. In line with the TIPID Movement and the National Savings for Progress Campaign, school children and students are encouraged not only to save but also to work on projects that will generate income for them. This is designed to foster in school children and students the habit of thrift and industry (TIPID is an acronym for Thrift Incentives for Progress through Industry and Discipline). The habit of saving can be further developed if children become deeply involved in production-oriented and income-generating projects.
2. The National Commission on Savings through the joint efforts of the Central Bank of the Philippines and the Ministry of Education and Culture is extending for another year the program of giving TIPID incentive awards to elementary, general secondary, and vocational-technical high schools having the most effective income-generating projects for the school year 1979-1980. This year, a national prize will be awarded to such elementary, general secondary, and vocational-technical secondary school with the best TIPID Movement incentive project. In this connection, contests will be held on the regional, division, and district levels.
3. All elementary schools, general secondary schools, and vocational-technical high schools, therefore, are enjoined to strengthen and/or put up more income generating projects such as: handicraft, bamboo craft, shell craft, poultry raising, piggery, vegetable gardens, fish culture, etc.
4. Awards and national prizes of the winning school projects will be given by the Central Bank of the Philippines.

5. Enclosed are copies of the Official Entry Rules and Forms for the 1979-1980 Awards as well as the Rules and Guidelines for Program Management and Selection of Winners, Resume of Winning Entries, and Table of Participating Schools.

6. Immediate dissemination of the contents of this Memorandum is desired.

OFFICIAL ENTRY RULES

1. The 1979-1980 TIPID Movement School Incentive Award Program is a plan of the National Commission on Savings designed to reward schools with the most effective income generating project. The program is open to all elementary, general secondary, and vocational-technical secondary schools, both public and private, on municipal, provincial, regional and national levels. As a precondition to participation in the award program, however, the school must have an ongoing or should organize a TIPID Movement Savings Club.

2. Entry forms (Form No. 1, a copy of which is attached) may be obtained from any of the following offices:

- a. Office of the District Supervisor
- b. Office of the School Superintendent
- c. Office of the MEC Regional Director

Participating schools shall submit not later than November 29, 1979 their accomplished entry forms as follows:

- a. The original and one copy to the Office of the MEC District Supervisor;
- b. One copy to the Office of the MEC Provincial or City Schools Superintendent, as the case may be;
- c. One copy to the Office of the MEC Regional Director;
- d. One copy to the Secretariat, Committee on Savings

and retain one copy for the school.

3. Participants in the 1979-1980 TIPID Movement School Incentive Award Program shall display a sign or notice of participation at a conspicuous place at the site of the project. The sign on a piece of board or tin plate least 1/2 X 1 meter in size shall bear the following:

FOR A PROGRESSIVE PHILIPPINES

The project or projects should be the same project or projects indicated in the entry form.

4. A winner shall be chosen from among the schools in each of the following categories:

- a. elementary
- b. general secondary
- c. vocational-technical secondary

5. The winners in each category on the municipal level shall compete on the provincial level; the provincial winners in each category shall compete on the regional level; and the regional winners in each category shall compete for the national prize.

6. Winning schools in each of the three categories on the municipal and provincial levels shall be awarded certificates and plaques of merit, respectively. Winners in each of the three categories on the regional level shall be awarded a prize or prizes worth not less than THREE THOUSAND PESOS (P3,000.00). Winners in each of the three categories on the national level shall be awarded a prize or prizes worth not less than FIVE THOUSAND PESOS (P5,000.00).

7. Schools engaged in income generating projects whether producing goods or services getting the highest number of points in accordance with the criteria for each of the three levels shall be declared winners. These projects, which may be undertaken within or outside the school premises, may include but not necessarily be limited to, the following:

- a. Handicraft
- b. Poultry raising
- c. Swine raising
- d. Vegetable gardening
- e. Fish culture
- f. Shoe shining
- g. Food catering
- h. Others

8. The projects shall be judged in accordance with the following criteria with the corresponding weights:

	<u>Weights</u>
a. Effectiveness to generate income -	30%

The project has the highest rate of return on investment and all or part of the

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- b. Utilization of native or recycled materials - 20%

The project utilizes as major components local materials. However, imported materials preferably in the form of discarded materials, recycled items, etc. may also be used.

- c. Extent and degree of student participation - 20%

The project is participated in actively by the most number of students in relation to total school population.

- d. Originality and Novelty - 15%

The project is original, or if based on an old idea should manifest innovations for improvement and effectiveness.

- e. Sustained activities for a continuing project - 15%

The project is a continuing one which shall run for at least one school year.

9. The deadline for the selection of the most effective income generating project for the different levels shall be as follows:

- a. Municipal level - February 15, 1980
- b. Provincial level - March 15, 1980
- c. Regional level - April 15, 1980
- e. National level - May 15, 1980

The awarding of prizes shall be held during ceremonies in June 1980, with the date and place thereof to be announced later.

Prizes will be awarded by the National Commission on Savings at ceremonies to be held in June 1980, the specific date and place thereof to be announced later.
