SEMINAR WORKSHOP ON "UPGRADING COLLEGE TEACHING"

1. With the assistance of Region IV (NSP), Ameliano University will conduct at its premises in Legarda, Sampaloc, Manila, an in-service education program/seminar on "Upgrading College Teaching" from October 23 to 25, 1979. The program will consist of a series of lectures, followed by demonstrations and an open forum.
2. The following teaching strategies, among others, will be taken up in this seminar:
  - a. The Discovery Approach
  - b. The Process Approach
  - c. Sociodrama with Role Playing
  - d. The Case Study
  - e. Approaches to the Teaching of Literature
  - f. The Problem Method
  - g. The Conceptual Approach
  - h. Group Discussion Method
3. In view of the felt need to improve classroom instruction in our tertiary institutions, and in line with MEC Memorandum No. 150, s. 1979, suggesting the use of "a variety of techniques of teaching that will enhance student learning," it is requested that faculty members and school officials, particularly those in Region IV (NSP) and the surrounding regions, be encouraged to attend this seminar. Attendance on the part of personnel under this Ministry will be on official time only.
4. Participants to this seminar will be charged a fee of ₱50 which will cover expenses for registration and handouts as well as for lunches and snacks for three days.
