MULTI-LEVEL NATIONAL WORK-CONFERENCE ON EDUCATIONAL TECHNOLOGY

To: Bureau Directors
Regional Directors
Chiefs of Services and Heads of Units
Schools Superintendents
Presidents, State Colleges and Universities

1. The Ministry of Education and Culture, with the cooperation of the Asian Center of Educational Innovation for Development, Unesco Regional Office for Education, Bangkok, Thailand, will conduct a multi-level national work-conference on educational technology with emphasis on low-cost educational materials, on November 26-29, 1978 at the Teachers Camp, Baguio City.
2. The objectives, expected outcomes, and various activities of the work-conference and the list of participants are inclosed.
3. Participants are requested to take along some models of teacher/pupil-prepared educational materials for display during the conference. Such exemplar materials should be properly labelled.
4. In the selection of participants preference must be given to those who have attended the national workshop on educational technology with special reference to development of low-cost educational materials in Lemery, Pangasinan in August 1978 or any of the regional seminar-workshops on the preparation of support instructional materials, or those who are in charge of Educational Media Program in the division or school.
5. Per diems and transportation expenses of participants to Baguio City and return to their respective stations should be charged against local funds, subject to the usual accounting and auditing regulations.
6. The inclosed registration form, duly accomplished by the recommended participant, should reach the Bureau of Elementary Education, MEC, Manila on or before November 9, 1978.

7. It is desired that this Memorandum be disseminated immediately.



OBJECTIVES:

1. To intensify awareness of the values of and need for low-cost educational materials including games and toys in teaching-learning situations.
2. To evolve a set of guidelines for designing, development, and utilization of low-cost educational materials.
3. To identify unused and under-utilized indigenous materials and locally available materials for the production of low-cost educational materials.
4. To prepare a program to maximize the production and utilization of low-cost educational materials for the improvement of instruction.

EXPECTED OUTCOMES:

1. A national program to maximize the production and utilization of low-cost educational materials with the optimum use of indigenous locally available resources and cultural heritage and capabilities.
2. A set of guidelines for designing, development and utilization of low-cost educational materials.
3. An inventory of low-cost educational materials including toys and games available in each region.
4. An inventory of indigenous raw materials, throw-aways, scraps and other materials, which could be utilized in the production of low-cost educational materials.
5. Maximum utilization of existing EMCs as hubs for display and demonstrations on the development and utilization of low-cost educational materials.

ACTIVITIES:

1. Display of low-cost educational materials including games and toys produced from indigenous materials, scraps and throw-aways.
2. Plenary discussion sessions -
 - a. Low-Cost Educational Materials Including Cultural Games and Toys: A Trend in Teaching Effectiveness
 - b. Basic Principles in Designing, Development and Utilization of Low-Cost Educational Materials
 - c. Techniques and Methods in the Production of Low-Cost Educational Materials
3. Group discussion sessions -
 - a. Identification and Classification of Low-Cost Educational Materials, Cultural Games and Toys in the Different Regions

- b. Identification and Classification of Unused and Under-Utilized Indigenous Materials, Scripts and Foreways for Educational Materials
- c. Guidelines for Designing, Development and Utilization of Low-Cost Educational Materials
- d. Plan for a National Program to Maximize the Production and Utilization of Low-Cost Educational Materials
