1973 SHANKAR'S INTERNATIONAL CHILDREN'S
ART CONVENTION

1. An invitation has been extended to Filipino children below sixteen (16) years old to participate in the 1973 Shankar's International Children's Competition in painting and writing.
2. In view of the benefits derived from this competition which helps promote goodwill and understanding among children of the world and encourages the development of their artistic and literary talents, as many qualified school children as possible should be encouraged to participate. In the past competition in painting, several Filipino children won distinction w/ valuable prizes.
3. Inclosed are the rules of the contest which must be strictly observed. Entries should be sent direct to: Shankar's International Children's Competition, Nehru House, 4 Bahadur Shah Zafar Marg, New Delhi 110002, India.
4. It is requested that this Memorandum and its inclosure be given wide publicity.

COMPETITION RULES

1. Children all over the world can participate in Shankar's International Children's Competition 1979.
2. Only children below 16, i.e., those born on or after January 1, 1964, can participate in the Competition.
3. Each entry should be accompanied by a certificate from the parent/guardian or teacher that it is the original and unaided work of the competitor during 1979.
4. Each entry should carry the following details. These must be written in BLOCK LETTERS and in ENGLISH, on the back of the painting or at the end of the written work, as the case may be.
 - I) Full name of the competitor
 - II) Full address
 - III) Date of birth
 - IV) Nationality
 - V) Whether boy or girl
 - VI) Subject/Title of the entry

Entries which do not carry these details will not be considered.

5. Entries by more than one competitor can be sent together.

7. Entries should reach the above address on or before December 31, 1979. Foreign competitors are advised to despatch their entries well in advance to allow sufficient time for transit if sent by surface mail.
8. Entries will NOT be returned.

PAINTINGS/DRAWINGS

9. Paintings or drawings may be done in any media, except black lead pencil.
10. The size of the painting or drawing should be NOT LESS than 30cm x 40cm. (12" x 16").
11. A competitor may submit up to 6 entries. They must be sent UNMOUNTED.
12. Paintings or drawings may be on any subject the competitor has seen or is interested in.
13. Combined work will not be accepted.

WRITTEN WORK

14. Only entries in ENGLISH will be considered.
15. A competitor may submit up to 6 entries.
16. Entries may be in the form of essays, short stories, poems, plays, descriptive writings, etc.
17. The written work may be on any subject the competitor has seen or is interested in.

PRIZES

18. The award of prizes will be decided by the organizers of the Competition with the help of a panel of judges.
19. The painting or drawing adjudged the best will be awarded the President of India's Gold Medal. The Vice-President of India's Gold Medal will be given for the best written work. Besides the above, 24 Shankar Lal Nehru Memorial Gold Medals, and over 400 prizes and 400 Silver Medals for the next best entries will be awarded. All paintings selected for the Shankar's International Children's Art Exhibition will receive Certificates of Merit.
20. No Competitor will be awarded more than 2 prizes.
21. The copyright of all entries will rest with the Shankar's International Children's Competition.

22. Among paintings, all those which win prizes other than Silver Medals, and among written entries, all those awarded prizes and a few winning Silver Medals will be published in "Shankar's Children's Art Number Volume 31". Some selected entries will also be published in the "Children's World", a monthly magazine dedicated to the children of the world.
23. All competitors can get "Shankar's Children's Art Number Volume 31" at half price (Rs. 15 for competitors from India only). Any competitor can reserve a copy by sending the coupon duly filled in.

NOTE: Vol. 31 is expected to be ready for mailing in December 1980.
