SIXTH NATIONAL WORK-CONFERENCE OF THE UNESCO ASSOCIATED SCHOOLS
PROJECT AND UNESCO CLUBS ON EDUCATION FOR INTERNATIONAL
COOPERATION AND PEACE

To: Bureau Directors
Regional Directors
Schools Superintendents
Presidents, State Colleges and
Universities

1. In consonance with the declaration by the Philippine Government of the Decade of the Filipino Child 1977-1987 and in full support of the observance of the International Year of the Child, and Human Rights, the UNESCO Headquarters, the UNESCO National Commission of the Philippines and the National Research and Development Centre for Teacher Education, Ministry of Education and Culture, will sponsor the Sixth National Work-Conference of UNESCO Clubs and Associated Schools Project on Education for International Cooperation and Peace from December 10 to 15, 1979 at Atienza's Seminar Center, 11, Saldon Street, Zamboanga City.

2. The theme of the work-conference is "The Growing Child: the Future and Fulfillment of Humanity." Conceptual themes for each level of education are:

- Elementary level - "The Child: Our Most Precious Resource"
- Secondary level - "The Student in the New Society"
- Tertiary level - "The Individual as a Responsible Citizen"
- Non-Formal Education - "The Filipino as a Self-Sufficient Participating Citizen."

3. Specifically, the participants in the work-conference are expected to:

- a. render reports and share experiences on the latest projects or activities being undertaken by UNESCO Clubs and Associated Schools in the elementary,

secondary and tertiary levels as well as on non-formal education;

- b. prepare posters related to the theme with guidelines on how to use them for Grades I to III;
- c. write brochures or teaching guides for Grades IV to VI on relevant subject areas;
- d. evolve self-learning models for the secondary level and school leavers;
- e. construct syllabi for the tertiary level on relevant courses related to the theme;
- f. amend the UNAP Constitution and make it more responsive to present needs.

4. Inclosure No. 1 is a tentative list of authorized participants to the work-conference who are actually involved in the UNESCO Associated Schools project and UNESCO Clubs activities. It is urged that these participants be informed immediately of their involvement.

5. Participants are requested to bring some reference materials, self-learning instructional models, brochures and guides that would help attain the objectives set forth.

6. Delegates are requested to prepare a pictorial and comprehensive report of their school's and institution's projects or activities to be rendered during the conference following the suggested outline in Inclosure No. 2.

7. If the participants listed in the inclosure cannot attend, the National Coordinator of the UNESCO Associated Schools and UNESCO Clubs, through the National Research and Development Center for Teacher Education (NRECTE), Ministry of Education and Culture, should be informed immediately to enable the organizing committee to readjust the plan for assignments, lodging and accommodations.

8. Transportation expenses, registration fee of P75 and allowance of P10 a day are chargeable against regional, division or local funds subject to availability and the usual accounting rules and regulations.

9. Board and lodging of the officially listed participants will be charged against UNESCO, starting at noon dinner on Sunday, December 9th to breakfast on December 10th.

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10. Superintendents and social studies supervisors in Region IX are encouraged to attend this conference provided that all their expenses will be charged against regional, division or local funds.

11. It is desired that the contents of this Memorandum be brought to the immediate attention of all concerned.
