SECOND SEMINAR-WORKSHOP ON EFFECTIVE LEADERSHIP FOR THE JOB  
CREATION PROGRAM AND MANPOWER DEVELOPMENT THROUGH THE  
"STUDY NOW PAY LATER PLAN"

To: Bureau Directors  
Regional Directors  
Schools Superintendents  
Presidents, State Colleges and Universities

1. In support of the government thrusts for national development and to further strengthen the democratization of educational opportunities, a Seminar-Workshop on Effective Leadership for Job Creation Program and Manpower Development through the "Study Now Pay Later Plan" is to be conducted at Teachers' Camp, Baguio City on November 26-29, 1979 for coordinators and supportive staff of the educational loan assistance program.
2. At the end of the seminar-workshop the participants are expected to:
  - a. have fully understood their role in the effective implementation and prosecution of the Job Creation Program and Manpower Development through the educational loan assistance program;
  - b. have threshed out problems and found out remedial measures and/or solutions to problems having been encountered and being foreseen;
  - c. have been apprised of the status of the educational loan assistance program from school year 1976-1977 to the present;
  - d. identify some of the priority non-degree and degree courses necessary for regional development of their respective regions; and
  - e. have prepared a list of priority courses and a workable action plan for their respective regions and/or schools.

4. The names of the participants together with a health certificate (Dep. Form 88) duly signed by a government physician attesting to their being physically fit should be submitted to the National Educational Loan Assistance Center, Ministry of Education and Culture, Manila, on or before November 5, 1978. Those participants who are in charge of the STSP program are expected to arrive and register at the venue of the seminar-workshop in the afternoon of November 25, 1978.

5. The participants are requested to bring with them the following:

- a. List of suggested priority courses necessary for their respective regions and schools;
- b. Brief narrative status report on the implementation of the Study Now Day Later Plan covering the SY 1976-1977 to the present;
- c. Action plan for each region; and
- d. Problems encountered and suggested solutions.

6. Expenses incident to this seminar-workshop which are chargeable against the funds of the National Educational Loan Assistance Center, and additional daily allowance of 710 entitled each participant which may be charged against local funds are both subject to the usual accounting and auditing regulations.









7. Inclosed is a tentative schedule of activities for the duration of the seminar-workshop.

8. All officials concerned are enjoined to give preferential attention to this matter.
