11TH BIENNIAL CONFERENCE OF THE UNESCO
NATIONAL COMMISSION PHILIPPINES

To: Bureau Directors
Regional Directors
Chief of Services and Heads of Units
Presidents, State Colleges and Universities

1. In line with the current celebration of the International Year of the Child, the 11th Biennial Conference of the UNESCO National Commission Philippines will be held on December 17-18, 1979 at the Philippine International Convention Center (PICC). The conference will be focused on the needs of children in the Philippines and will review national issues on the areas of education and culture, natural sciences, social sciences, communications and the media. It will use the "Study on the Situation of Children in the Philippines" as a springboard for discussing and assessing policies and program directions.
2. The conference shall have the following objectives:
 - a. Discuss the needs and problems of Filipino children with a view to evolving recommendations for policy and programs through a review and assessment of the "Study on the Situation of Children in the Philippines" as part of the national observance of the International Year of the Child.
 - b. Assist UNESCO National Commission in the Philippines in the formulation of its policies and programs in relation to the Decade of the Filipino Child.
 - c. Assist government and non-government organizations to provide directions for planning and implementing projects for Filipino children in the 1980s.
 - d. At the end of the conference, the participants are expected to proceed with the following:



- a. Policy and program recommendations in the areas of education, culture, natural sciences, social sciences, and mass media for the improvement of the welfare of Filipino children based on a review of the "Study on the Situation of Children in the Philippines" and within the framework of the Decade of the Filipino Child, 1977-1987; and
- b. Recommended research areas for a more in-depth study of the problems facing children in the Philippines.
4. Participants in the conference shall come from the following groups: Natural Sciences, Education and Culture, Social Sciences and Mass Media. A list of participants included in the Education and Culture area is inclosed.
5. Expenses incident to the attendance in this conference shall be charged against local funds subject to the usual accounting and auditing rules and regulations.
6. Immediate dissemination of this Memorandum is desired.
