8TH NATIONAL CERAMICS FAIR

1. The 8th National Ceramics Fair will be held at the Marikina Institute of Science and Technology, Metro Manila, on February 11-16, 1980. This Ceramics Fair will be sponsored jointly by the Ministry of Education and Culture and the Ceramics Education Association of the Philippines (CEDAP).
2. Ceramics articles produced by member institutions of the Ceramics Education Association of the Philippines (CEDAP) will be on display.
3. Ceramic hobbyists, artists, suppliers and manufacturers will be invited to exhibit their products, supplies, materials, tools and equipment.
4. As a feature of the Ceramics Fair, a Ceramics Contest will be held. This will be open only to member institutions of the Ceramics Education Association of the Philippines (CEDAP). The contest rules and regulations are inclosed.

8. Heads and ceramics teachers/instructors of member institutions of the CEDAP are authorized to attend the opening of the Ceramics Fair on February 11, 1980. However, participating schools (with exhibits) may detail not more than two (2) personnel of the school concerned to arrange and manage their exhibits during the entire duration of the Fair. Expenses incurred in connection with this Ceramics Fair shall be charged against local school funds subject to the usual accounting and auditing regulations.

8TH NATIONAL CERAMICS CONTEST RULES AND REGULATIONS

1. The Contest is open to:
 - a. Ceramics students of member institutions of the Ceramics Education Association of the Philippines (CEDAP)
2. Ceramics articles eligible for entry are categorized as follows:
 - a. Pottery (earthenware)
 - b. Stoneware
 - c. Porcelain
 - d. Architectural/industrial clay products (unglazed)
(See Chart A. for further details)
3. Number of entries:
 - a. Each member institution is entitled to submit a maximum of fourteen (14) entries for the whole contest at two (2) entries per category group.
4. Entries must invariably be original work of students and have passed criteria set forth by local screening committees. Entries should reach the Marikina Institute of Science and Technology on or before February 7, 1980.
5. Judging:

A Board of Judges will select the winning entries using a criteria based on craftsmanship, originality, design and utility/functionality. Judging of entries will be held on February 15, 1980. The decision of the judges will be final.

6. Prizes:

- a. Each category will be entitled to the following prizes:

1st - cash prize of ₱150.00
2nd - cash prize of 100.00
3rd - cash prize of 50.00

- b. Trophies will be awarded to schools with the greatest number of prize winning entries. The point system of evaluation shall be followed:

1st prize - 3 points
2nd prize - 2 points
3rd prize - 1 point

- c. All participants in the National Contest shall be awarded Certificates of Participation.

- d. Winning entries shall be given Certificates of Merit.

- e. The awarding of prizes will be made on February 16, 1980.

7. All participants in the National Ceramics Fair shall be awarded plaques/certificates of participation/appreciation.

8. Owners of entries will have the option to sell and/or donate their articles. All sales shall be subject to 15 per cent commission payable to the CEDAP and which shall accrue to a special fund to help defray the expenses of the National Ceramics Contest. However, sold articles shall be removed only after February 16, 1980.
