- 1. The International Reading Association (IRA), a professional organization of individuals concerned with the improvement of reading, will hold its Eighth World Congress on Reading at the Philippine Plaza Hotel, Manila, on August 5-7, 1980, with the theme "The 1980s Problems and Promises."
- 2. The IRA holds this Congress to fulfill a need for educational planners, strategists, language teachers and scholars to come together in an educational effort at identifying and offering solutions to problems in reading world-wide, and in envisioning what the decade of the 80s should be for international efforts at achieving education's goals more efficiently through reading. The objective of this year's meeting is to promote the development of a level of reading proficiency that is within each individual's unique capacity.

 be on official time only in compliance with LOI No. 981.
