BVNS PHYSICAL EDUCATION COURSES FOR TEACHERS
AT ILAGAN, ISABELA

1. Courses for elementary and secondary physical education teachers and supervisors from public and private schools will be offered by the BVNS in cooperation with MEC Isabela from April 14 to May 24, 1980. The venue of this teacher summer training will be at the Isabela High School and the P. Paquirigan Memorial Athletic Stadium, Ilagan, Isabela.

2. The regular courses to be offered both in the undergraduate and graduate levels will be credited by the BVNS towards the Master of Arts in Education degree.

3. The subject offerings above for each of the program/level are subject to change depending on the priority of students, the availability of qualified instructors, and the number of students who will enroll in a class to warrant its organization.

4. School officials, classroom teachers in Region II are encouraged to take these undergraduate and graduate courses considering the proximity of the training site to their place of assignment.

5. Enrolment will be limited to P.E. teachers and coaches who are directly involved in teaching physical education classes and coaching activities.

7. Classes will be held 6 days a week, Monday through Saturday, one period of 60 minutes daily will be scheduled for each 2-unit course; 90 minutes for 3-unit course; and 145 minutes for each course requiring laboratory experiments.

8. The maximum study load for either the undergraduate or the graduate level is nine (9) units in accordance with BPS Circular No. 7, s. 1973.
