In a letter to this Office dated March 24, 1980, the Charge d'Affaires of the Australian Embassy, Manila, stated that teaching is an overcrowded profession in Australia and that the Australian government is therefore not accepting applications from persons overseas who wish to migrate to Australia to enter the teaching profession.
- 2. The above information should correct any erroneous notion that may have been generated by MEC Memorandum No. 47, s. 1980.
- 3. It is desired that this Memorandum be given immediate and wide publicity.

RATIONALE

The Program of Continuing Education for Music Teachers, Professional Musicians and Laymen consists of short-term non-degree courses in various aspects of music and music education. It is designed to to meet the developmental needs of individuals engaged in the following areas in music:

- 1. Classroom teaching in the preparatory, elementary and high schools for updated know-ladge of new materials and revitalization of skills and techniques of pedagogy.
- 2. Choral conducting in schools and non-professional ensembles.
- Composition and arranging.
- 4. Theater

Some courses are also intended to benefit the non-professional musicians or music aficionados who are simply interested in expanding their musical horizons.

Completion of all the course offerings of the entire program (staggered within a 4-summber cycle) is meant to provide music competence and proficiency particularly useful to teachers and will earn for the participant a Program Certificate. A Certificate of Attendance will also be issued for each completed course.

Enrolment and payment of fees is done one hour before the first session of the course. However, in some classes where the number of students is limited, advance enrolment is advised. In some others, minimum numbers may be required to start.

All sessions will be held at the Abelardo Hall, $\textbf{U}_\bullet \textbf{P}_\bullet$ College of Music.

DESCRIPTION OF COURSES

Teaching Music in the Pre-School Fee - 7150

Different approaches for teaching basic music concepts at the pre-school level. These are learned through actual experiences and peer demonstrations during sessions. Compilation and organization of music materials appropriate for this level.

Elementary School Fee - 7150

Various teaching strategies for teaching music in the elementary school. Also includes know-how on selection and organization of teaching experiences and materials.

Various music teaching techniques for the secondary level. Objectives, content areas and planning, selection and erganization of teaching experiences and materials

Workshop in Orff Schulwerk (Basic) Fee - P150

Basic training and improvisation in body movements. Instructional materials to be used include both foreign and native songs, speech materials, and Orff and Philippine instruments.

Voice I, II, III, IV Fee - 7180

Vocal production and basic singing skills necessary for classroom teaching, choral training, and music theater.

Operetta Workshop Fee - F200

Basic training in vocal technique and experiences in stage singing, acting, directing, management, and production designs (setting, lighting, costuming, make-up) with emphasis on the production of school plays and operettas.

•Fee - 7170

The mechanics of choral training from auditioning to public performance. Concentration on conducting techniques and the organization of repertoire appropriate for particular choir groups.

Philippine Music Fee - 7120

Lectures and discussions with audio-visual aids on Philippine musical traditions.

Lectures and discussions with audio-visual aids on the musical traditions of at least five Asian countries.

Organizing and Teaching Rondalla Fee - F150

The mechanics of organizing and training a rondalla. Methods of teaching the various rondalla instruments (banduria, octavina, guitar) individually and collectively plus conducting techniques and repertoire.

Music Appreciation Fee - 2150

An introductory course in music appreciation for intelligent listening and heightening musical discrimination. Guided listening and simple analysts of music of different types, forms and styles.

Teaching Music and Related Arts Fee - P150

A study of the relationship of music to the other arts, their similarities and differences, and the various techniques of teaching these in general music classes.

Improvising and putting together musical instruments for classroom use from available materials in the environment.

Choral Arranging Fee - 2150

Study and application of techniques of arranging for various choral groups.

Instrumental Arranging Fee - P150

Study and application of techniques of arranging for various instrumental groups.

Workshop in Jazz/Popular Music . . Fee - \$150

Exposure to jazz and pop music and simple analysis of the musical processes, including simple arranging.

Creative Music Procedures . . . Fee - 2150

Experiments and exploration of new sound sources and musical organization.
