1981 NATIONAL SECONDARY SCHOOLS PRESS CONFERENCE

- 1. The National Secondary Schools Press Conference for the school year 1980-81 will be held at Teachers Camp, Baguio City on February 10-14, 1981.
- 2. The theme of this year's conference is "The School Paper and Its Supportive Role in Educational Development in the 1980s."
- 3. All the ten (10) winners in each of the contests held in the regional secondary schools press conferences and their school paper advisers are authorized to attend the National Secondary Schools Press Conference. These winners shall participate in the same contests as those where they won on the regional level.
- 4. Inclosed is the tentative list of activities for the conference.
- 5. For purposes of the group contests, school papers are bracketed into two: A and B. The bracketing is based on the school population, the school papers location and printing facilities available to it, and the performance in the last two national press conferences.
- 6. The principal of each school entering the group contests should send, by registered mail, twelve (12) copies each of at least two (2) issues of the paper published during the school year 1980-81 to reach this Office not later than January 12, 1981. However, high schools that publish separate

English and Pilipino papers may send only seven (7) copies of each of two (2) issues of the English paper and six (6) copies each of two (2) issues of the Pilipino paper. On the wrapper should be indicated the total enrolment of the school. The bundle should be addressed to:

- 7. Requests for accommodation should be sent direct to the Superintendent, Teachers Camp, Baguio City not later than January 30, 1981. Such requests should include information on the approximate time and date of the arrival of the delegation in Baguio City. Each delegation should arrange for its transportation to the conference site and return.
- 8. Board and lodging at \$30 a day and a registration fee of \$20 will be charged each delegate and adviser. A membership fee of \$10 for the National Secondary School Advisers Association will be collected by the treasurer during the conference. It is understood that expenses incident to the attendance in the conference will come from local funds, subject to the usual accounting and auditing rules. The private schools may have their own arrangements regarding the expenses of their delegates.
- 9. No teacher or student who is not in good health should be included in the delegation. Student delegates should have the written permission of their parents before making the trip to the conference.
- 10. Division and regional supervisors in charge of the campus journalism program and high school principals may attend the conference on official time. Expenses incident to their attendance at the conference may be charged against local/division/regional funds.
- ll. Immediate dissemination of this Memorandum to all those concerned in both the public and private schools, is desired.
