SEMINAR-WORKSHOP ON AGRARIAN REFORM FOR EDUCATORS

To: Bureau Directors
Regional Directors
Schools Superintendents
Presidents, State Colleges and Universities
Heads of Private Schools, Colleges
and Universities

1. The Philippine Normal College Graduate School, in cooperation with the Ministry of Education and Culture and the Ministry of Agrarian Reform, will offer a Seminar-Workshop on Agrarian Reform for Educators this summer 1981. The course is designed for teachers involved in the teaching of agrarian reform through the understanding of the philosophy, concepts and processes of agrarian reform as a strategy for national development, so that they may become instruments to hasten the development process.

2. The specific objectives are to:

- a. deepen their knowledge and understanding of the philosophy, concepts and practices of the agrarian reform program in the Philippines;
- b. internalize and appreciate the present program of implementation in the light of current problems and issues; and
- c. operationalize this knowledge in order to provide continuity to the enrichment of the curriculum through the integration of the concepts at all levels in the school system.

3. The program of study includes a sequence of topics to be handled by experts from the Ministry of Education and Culture, Ministry of Agrarian Reform, Land Bank of the Philippines, Ministry of Agriculture, Agrarian Reform Institute; etc, the use of relevant audio-visual instructional materials, the analysis of case studies on agrarian reform, field trips to land reform areas and other enrichment activities.

4. The seminar-workshop will be held from 8:30 A.M. to 12:00 Noon, 2:00 to 5:30 P.M. every Wednesday for a period of five (5) weeks from April 22 to May 20, 1981.
5. Students who are eligible for graduate studies may earn the equivalent of 2 units of credit for attendance and completion of seminar requirements. Participants who do not wish to pursue graduate studies will receive certificates of participation.
6. A seminar fee of ₱50 will be charged each participant.
7. Immediate dissemination of this Memorandum is desired.

1981 SUMMER SCHOOL HEALTH GUARDIAN PROGRAM

To: Bureau Directors
Regional Directors
Chiefs of Services and Heads of Units
Schools Superintendents

1. School physicians, dentists, nurses, medical technologists and dental aides are hereby directed to serve in barangays located in depressed or unserved rural areas from April 20 to May 22, instead of reporting at the regional and/or division offices.
2. In teams, these school health personnel will extend integrated health services to the people of the selected barangays; each team to cover at least two (2) barangays during the stated summer period. Among the health services that may be rendered by the teams are the following:
 - a. Health examination and treatment of common ailments;
 - b. Mass deworming; and
 - c. Dissemination of information on utilization of available medicinal plants/herbs for treatment of common ailments, environmental sanitation, health and nutrition education through community assemblies and home visits.
3. School health teams composed of the above mentioned personnel should, therefore, be immediately organized in every division. Each team should prepare its schedule of activities to be submitted to the schools superintendent for approval. All school health teams shall make the necessary arrangements with the barangay captains concerned. They should coordinate with provincial/municipal health officers, local health societies or chapters, civic organizations and local government officials to ensure cooperation and support for their proposed activities.

4. All members of the team, including nurses and medical technologists, are entitled to one month travel allowance similar to that received by medical and dental personnel during school days, subject to the usual auditing and accounting regulations.
5. A division consolidated report in this School Health Guardian Summer Program should be submitted to this Office, Attention: School Health and Nutrition Center, not later than June 30, 1981.
6. Immediate and wide dissemination of this Memorandum to all concerned is desired.
