SEMINAR WORKSHOP ON NUMERICAL CONTROL MACHINES

To: Regional Directors

- 1. A seminar-workshop on Numerical Control Machines under the joint sponsorship of the Technological University of the Philippines and the Philippine-Japan Friendship Association (PHILJAFA) will be held at the Main Campus, Technological University of the Philippines, on April 21-25, 1981.
- 2. The objectives for the seminar-workshop are:
 - a. to upgrade the knowledge and skills of machine shop instructors; and
 - b. to orient machine shop instructors in the use of modern machine tools and cutting tools.
- 3. Among the activities in the seminar-workshop are the following:
 - a. Programming and process-sheet making.
 - b. Numerical Control Machine operation, tape punching and tool setting and NC cutting.
 - c. Plant visits to industrial companies using numerical control machines.
- 4. Vocational schools/colleges, state colleges/universities may send one (1) Machine Shop Instructor, preferably one who has had training in Machine Shop in Japan, to attend the seminar-workshop. All expenses incident to attendance to the seminar-workshop, including

a seminar fee of \$\text{P200}\$ to cover handouts and project materials shall be charged against local funds, subject to the usual accounting and auditing rules and regulations.

- Participants to the seminar-workshop shall be limited to twenty-five (25). To be assured of slots, prospective participants are advised to register in writing with the Officer-in-Charge, College of Engineering, Technological University of the Philippines, Ayala Boulevard, Ermita, Manila, on or before April 15, 1981.
- 6. Immediate and wide dissemination of this Memorandum is desired.
