STAFF DEVELOPMENT PROGRAM IN MARITIME
EDUCATION

To: Bureau Directors
Regional Directors
Schools Superintendents
Presidents, State Colleges and Universities
Heads of Private Schools, Colleges and Universities

1. A two-phased staff development program for maritime education and training, under the auspices of the National Maritime Polytechnic (NMP) in cooperation with the Inter-Agency Technical Committee on Maritime Education (IATCOME), the Philippine Association of Maritime Institutions (PAMI), and the Ministry of Education and Culture (MEC) will be held in Manila, Cebu City and Davao City from May 25 to June 7, 1981.
2. The program aims to upgrade the teaching competencies of instructors in maritime courses along communication skills, teaching principles and contemporary strategies, educational psychology, planning and programming, and measurement and evaluation. The program content and particulars are given in the enclosure to this Memorandum.
3. Program participants will consist of 18 regional trainers, and six Merchant Marine instructors per school who are teaching professional maritime and cultural subjects in public and private maritime institutions of learning.
4. Phase I of the program will be held at the NMP in Manila, Jorama Restaurant from May 25-27, 1981. Phase II will be held simultaneously from May 29 to June 7, 1981 at Philippine Merchant Marine School (PMMS), Manila for Luzon; Cebu Central Colleges, Cebu City for the Visayas; and MATS College of Technology, Davao City, for Mindanao.
5. At the end of the staff development program for maritime education and training, the participants should be able to:

- a. plan and program properly various maritime education courses being offered in maritime institutions;
 - b. construct syllabi and devise instructional materials for specific lessons in maritime education;
 - c. apply appropriate teaching strategies for all maritime subjects;
 - d. construct valid and reliable test for evaluation and research purposes; and
 - e. evolve an institutional staff development program.
6. Participants' travel expenses, per diems, and allowances will be charged against school funds, subject to the usual auditing rules and regulations.
7. All school heads of maritime institutions are enjoined to send participants to this training program.
8. Immediate dissemination of this Memorandum is desired.

Phase I - Regional Trainers Development Program

1. Six trainers/participants from the three (3) zonal centers, namely Luzon, Visayas and Mindanao must have the following qualifications:
 - a. Holder of at least a Masters degree preferably in Education and a member of the Faculty in one of the maritime institutions in the zone;
2. A capsule course equivalent to one (1) unit each in Educational Psychology, Communication Skills, Educational Planning and Programming, Foundations of Teaching, Strategies of Teaching and Measurement and Evaluation will be discussed by the following National Trainers:

3. Orientation to Maritime Education and Training will be handled by the following:
 - a. Captain Benjamin Tañedo - NMP President
 - b. Mr. Anthony R. Nicanor - MEC-IATCOME Chairman

4. A fee of P800 will be charged every participant.
5. The Program will be from eight in the morning to nine in the evening on May 25 - 27, 1981 at the New Jorama Restaurant at San Marcelino Street, Manila.
6. NMP, IATCOME, PAMI and BHE officials and members are invited to attend the whole proceedings as observers.

Phase II - Institutional Trainors Development Program

1. Six (6) institutional trainors from each maritime institutions offering B.S. Marine Transportation (BSMT), Associate in Marine Engineering (AME), and B.S. Naval Architecture and Marine Engineering and at least three (3) from each maritime institutions offering the six-month Basic Seaman Course, and other maritime vocational courses shall be selected to attend this Development Program.
2. The participants must have the following qualifications:
 - a. a bachelors degree or an associate degree holder in any of the maritime courses;
 - b. for the maritime vocational institutions, one must be the registrar or any administrative official, one communication teacher and one maritime instructor.
 - c. for the degree giving maritime institutions, one administrative official, one communication instructor, and four maritime instructors in navigation, seamanship, safety of life at sea, maritime rules and regulations and ship business.
3. A fee of P800 will be charged every participant.

4. The seminar shall be conducted for 10 days from eight in the morning to nine in the evening. Peer teaching shall be conducted in the last three days of the training program.
5. The subject matters to be covered will be similar to that of the Phase I for 18 hours each. Participants may apply for accreditation for undergraduate units in education.
6. All participants will report respectively to their zonal centers for Luzon, Visayas and Mindanao.
