SEARCH FOR THE 1981 HOME ECONOMISTS IN PHILIPPINE
EDUCATION (HOPE) AWARD

1. The Philippine Home Economics Association (PHEA) in cooperation with the Ministry of Education and Culture is conducting the Search for the 1981 Home Economists in Philippine Education (HOPE) Award with the objective of:

- a. Extending recognition to outstanding home economics teachers and students in the elementary and secondary levels for valuable contribution towards the improvement of family and community life; and
- b. Providing incentive and inspiration to home economics teachers and students who conscientiously work towards the achievement of the objectives of home economics education.

2. The search launched on July 1, 1981 during the PHEA National Seminar in consonance with the seminar theme, "The Family, a Vital Force in Nation Building" will include regional and national categories and is open to home economics teachers and students in the elementary and secondary levels in both the public and private schools. Guidelines on the search are listed in the TROSCORE for the reference and guidance of all concerned.

3. In view of the laudable objectives of this project in promoting home economics education which undoubtedly contributes to the total development of the youth towards eventual self actualization, responsible involvement in family and national development, it is enjoined that wide dissemination and full support be given to this activity.

GUIDELINES ON THE SEARCH FOR THE 1981 HOME ECONOMISTS
IN PHILIPPINE EDUCATION (HOPE) AWARD

A. Contest Categories

The contest has four (4) categories:

1. The Most Outstanding Home Economics Teacher in the Elementary Level
2. The Most Outstanding Home Economics Teacher in the Secondary Level
3. The Most Outstanding Home Economics Pupil in the Elementary Level
4. The Most Outstanding Home Economics Student in the Secondary Level

B. Participants

1. The contest is open to home economics teachers and pupils/students in elementary and secondary levels in both the public and private schools.
2. Contestants should be active members of the local PHEA/FHP Chapter, certified to by the Division Home Economics Supervisor upon recommendation of the PHEA/FHP Chapter Adviser.
3. Teacher-contestants should have had training in Home Economics in the undergraduate level and should be teaching Home Economics at the time of their participation in the contest.
4. Pupil-contestants should be in Grade VI or Grade VII (whichever is the last grade in the particular school attended) at the time of their participation in the contest for the elementary level.
5. Student-contestants should be in the Fourth Year High School at the time of their participation in the contest for the secondary level.

C. General Criteria for Judging

1. Innovative ideas contributed to the field of home economics

2. Skills in home economics put into practice to improve family life
3. Participation in school and community development programs
4. Positive leadership and good personal and moral character
5. Commendable record of performance as evidenced by observation reports, awards, citations, and commendations
6. Active participation in the Chapter PHEA/FHP Organizations.

D. HOPE Awards

1. National Awards plus two-year scholarship in local universities and Presidential Trophies will be given to the national winners of each of the four contest categories.
2. Regional Award - Awards of Merit will be given to the regional winners of each of the four contest categories.
3. Division Award - Certificates of Recognition will be given to the division winners of each of the contest categories.
4. District Award - Certificates of Participation will be given to the district winners of each of the four contest categories.

E. General Contest Procedures

1. Selection of candidates shall start from the school level. Nominations at the school level shall be accompanied by a fully accomplished Nomination Form and the necessary supporting documents, certified to as true and correct by the School Principal.
2. The Official Criteria for Judging and the Rating Sheet prepared by the National Contest Committee shall be used by the Boards of Judges in rating contestants.

3. Evaluation shall not be confined to records and supporting documents submitted. Classroom observations of teacher-candidates and written and/or practical tests for student-candidates shall be officially adopted as evaluative measurements and its records considered as supporting documents.
4. Each school with potential candidates is enjoined to create its local committee to screen and select its school nominees.
5. A Board of Judges at the district, division and regional levels shall be designated by the National Contest Committee.
6. The Board of Judges of any contest level and category shall not include those related to any of the contestants by consanguinity or affinity. Neither should they be teachers or advisers of a class, club, or organization to which any of the contestants belong.
7. The Board of Judges of each school shall screen and evaluate records and supporting documents of school finalists and select only one candidate for each contest category to represent the district in the district level contest.
8. The Board of Judges of each school district shall screen and evaluate records and supporting documents of school finalists and select only one candidate for each contest category to represent the district in the division level contest.
9. The Board of Judges of each school division shall screen and evaluate records and supporting documents of district finalists and select only one candidate for each contest category to represent the division in the regional-level contest.
10. The Board of Judges of each region shall screen and evaluate records and supporting documents of division finalists and select only one candidate for each contest category to represent the region in the National Contest.

The Regional finalists shall be proclaimed as the most outstanding teacher/student in the region for the elementary/secondary level.

11. The Board of Judges for the national contest shall screen and evaluate records and supporting documents of regional finalists and employ other evaluative instruments to select only one winner for each contest category who will be proclaimed as the Most Outstanding Teacher/Student for the Elementary/Secondary level in country.
12. There shall be only one finalist/winner in each contest category for each contest level.
13. In the event of a tie, a review of the records and supporting documents or the use of other means of evaluation shall be resorted to in order to break the tie.
14. The decisions of the Board of Judges at all levels and in all contest categories shall be considered final and irrevocable.
15. A ranking list and evaluation report for each contest category in each contest level shall be prepared by the Board of Judges, signed by all members of the Board and attested to as correct. These shall be submitted to the Board of Judges of the next contest level together with the supporting documents and all other records of the winners for each contest category.
16. All records of other contestants shall be kept in file for at least two years by the Board which screened them.
17. For purposes of synchronization, it is important that the Board of Judges at each contest level follow the timetable strictly, particularly with regard to the submission of official results.
18. The district supervisor/division superintendent/regional director shall officially announce the results of the contest at their respective levels.
