NATIONAL SEMINAR-WORKSHOP FOR RESEARCH AND EVALUATION
IN LITERACY AND ADULT/NONFORMAL EDUCATION

To: Bureau Directors
Regional Directors
Schools Superintendents

1. The Office of Nonformal Education (ONFE) of the Ministry of Education and Culture and the Unesco Regional Office for Education in Asia and the Pacific (ROEAP), Bangkok, Thailand are jointly sponsoring a National Seminar-Workshop for Research and Evaluation in Literacy and Adult/Nonformal Education to be held at the Hiyas ng Bulakan, Malolos, Bulacan on November 9-15, 1981.

2. The objectives of the seminar-workshop are:

- a. to provide a forum for the sharing or exchange of experiences on research and evaluation relevant to literacy and adult/nonformal education;
- b. to develop greater awareness on the need for research and evaluation for improving and/or strengthening non-formal education programs;
- c. to develop skills and abilities in identifying relevant research projects or activities and developing research designs to meet the urgent nonformal education needs of the different regions in the country; and
- d. to develop appropriate and effective evaluation guidelines for literacy and nonformal education.

3. Some of the expected outcomes of the seminar-workshop would be: increased awareness, knowledge and understanding of research and evaluation for strengthening literacy and nonformal education; skills and abilities in identifying suitable projects for research, in developing research designs suited to regional needs and in developing evaluation guidelines for literacy and nonformal education.

4. Regional directors are requested to select two participants from their respective regions, one assistant schools superintendent and one division NFE supervisor to participate in the seminar-workshop. Some nonformal educators from other government and non-government agencies in the country are enjoined to attend the seminar. The names of the two participants from each region should be submitted immediately to the Office of Nonformal Education, MEC, Manila.

5. Each participant is requested to prepare and bring to the seminar a brief writeup (5 to 10 pages, double space, short size bond paper) of their experiences in research and evaluation in literacy and nonformal education in their respective school divisions. They should also bring to the seminar data on out-of-school youth in their divisions and in their respective regions, if available. The data should show the total number of OSYs, male and female, in every barangay or district.

6. The expenses for board and lodging of all the participants will be paid from the funds of Unesco and the CNFE. Transportation expenses to and from the venue of the seminar will be borne by the participants themselves, chargeable against local funds.

7. Immediate dissemination of this Memorandum and compliance with the requirements by all concerned are enjoined.

YEAR-ROUND REGIONAL WORK-CONFERENCES
IN HOME ECONOMICS

1. The Philippine Home Economics Association (PHEA), in cooperation with the Ministry of Education and Culture, is conducting a series of regional work-conferences. Inclosed is a tentative schedule of activities of the conference.

2. The objective of the work-conference is to bring together all home economists throughout the country to discover ways and means of identifying and strengthening the role of Home Economics in meeting the challenges of the New Republic and their involvement in family and nation building.

3. The program of activities includes a series of three-day work-conferences scheduled in four places, as follows:
