SEVENTH NATIONAL SEMINAR-WORKSHOP OF THE NATIONAL FEDERATION OF UNESCO CLUBS AND ASSOCIATED SCHOOLS PROJECT ON EDUCATION FOR INTERNATIONAL COOPERATION AND PEACE

- 1. The National Federation of Unesco Clubs and Associated Schools in the Philippines (NFUCASP) will convene the seventh national seminar workshop on education for international understanding, cooperation and peace, in collaboration with the National Research and Development Centre for Teacher Education, Ministry of Education and Culture, UNESCO Headquarters, Paris and the UNESCO National Commission of the Philippines from December 7 to 12, 1981, at Palawan Teachers College, Puerto Princesa City.
- 21 The theme of the seminar-workshop is "Unity in Diversity for National and Global Concern", with the following conceptual themes for each level of education:

### Elementary Level

Kindergarten to Grade III - Commonalities and differences among individuals as bases for mutual cooperation and peace.

Grade IV to Grade VI - Unique characteristics and diverse cultures of various groups of peoples in the national and world community.

#### Secondary Level

First Year - Ethnic groups in Luzon, Visayas and Mindanao and their implication to the national and world community.

Second Year - Unity through the new international information order as a dimension for national and global cooperation and progress.

Third Year - Sociocconomic equity and ecological balance as concomitant factors for an improved quality of life in a diverse national, regional and global community.

Fourth Year - Unity and peaceful co-existence through human rights and the fundamental freedoms.

### Tertiary Level

Nationalism as a basic foundation for global unity and development.

## Non-Formal Education

Self-reliance for national and world progress.

- 3. Specifically, the participants in the seminar-worksh are expected to:
  - a. present comprehensive reports on projects or activities undertaken by Unesco Clubs and Associated Schools for the past 2 years.
  - b. prepare appropriate story-line package for kindergarten to Grade III on commonalities and differences among individuals.
  - c. write resource materials on cultures of peoples in the Philippines and other countries of the world.
  - d. construct instructional units for the secondary level about cultural differences of the national, regional and the world community.
  - e. prepare course syllabi on Comparative Educational Systems and Contemporary World Literature of developed and developing nations.
  - f. prepare a cross-cultural research design on cultural diversities as these contribute towards international understanding and cooperation.
  - g. produce materials for out-of-school youth in support of the "Kilusang Kabuhayan sa Kaunlaran."

- 4. Inclosure No. 1 is a tentative list of authorized participants to attend the seminar-workshop, who are actually involved in the Unesco Club movement and Associated Schools project on education for international understanding, cooperation and peace. It is desired that these participants be informed immediately of their involvement. If any participant listed in the inclosure cannot attend, the President of the NFUCASP, NRDCTE, Ministry of Education and Culture, Manila, should be informed soonest so as to allow readjustments in lodging and accommodations.
- 5. To insure optimum output derived from the objectives, all participants are requested to bring reference materials or prototype instructional models, brochures or guides for the grade level each is expected to work on.
- 6. The delegates are obliged to prepare comprehensive pictorial and well-edited reports of their schools or institution's projects or activities for the past two years to be exhibited and reported during the seminar-workshop following the outline in Inclosure No. 2. Members of the NFUCASP Board of Directors from each region will be responsible for the projects of member institutions to be exhibited during the seminar-workshop.
- 7. To encourage sharing of cultural heritage and understanding between and among regional and ethnic traditions, participants are strongly urged to bring Filipino costumes of their regions or their own personal choices for the opening ceremony and colorful cultural night presentation.
- 8. Transportation expenses, registration fee of P90 and an allowance of P10 a day are chargeable against regional, division, school or local funds subject to availability and the usual accounting and auditing rules and regulations. Board and lodging of officially listed participants will be charged against UNESCO starting from lunch on Sunday, December 6th to lunch on December 12th.
- 9. Superintendents and social studies supervisors in Region V are authorized to attend this seminar workshop provided that all their expenses including board and lodging of P40 a day will be charged against local funds.
- 10. Immediate dissemination of the contents of this Memorandum to all concerned is desired.
